*Proposed Improvement at Ballymacormick, Dromore,
Co. Down*

The Ministry of Home Affairs has made Regulations under Sections 26 and 42 of the Road Traffic Act (Northern Ireland) 1970 entitled the Road Vehicles

Lighting (Amendment) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1971 (S.R.&O. 1971, No. 72).

These Regulations require vehicles over 8 metres long and trailers over 5 metres long to carry two amber reflectors on both sides of the vehicle, one within 500 mm. of the rear and the other within the central third of the vehicle.

The reflectors will have to be fitted to new motor vehicles and trailers first used on or after 1st September, 1971, and to existing vehicles from 1st November, 1971, but will not apply to vehicles brought temporarily into Northern Ireland, public service vehicles, certain specialised vehicles and broken-down motor vehicles under 8 metres long when being towed.

The Regulations come into operation on 1st September, 1971, and may be obtained from H.M. Stationery Office, 80 Chichester Street, Belfast BT1 4JY.

The Ministry of Home Affairs has made Regulations under Section 26 of the Road Traffic Act (Northern Ireland) 1970 entitled the Motor Vehicles (Rear Marking) Regulations (N.I.) 1971 (S.R.&O. 1971, No. 71). These Regulations require motor vehicles exceeding 3 tons unladen weight and trailers exceeding 1 ton unladen weight to be fitted with a rear marker.

As from 1st November, 1971:

- (a) Vehicles not more than 13 metres long and trailers forming part of a combination of vehicles not more than 11 metres long will be required to fit a rear marking made up of alternative red fluorescent and yellow reflective material.
- (b) Vehicles more than 13 metres long will be required to fit a marking with the words **LONG VEHICLE** in black lettering on a yellow reflective background with a red fluorescent border.
- (c) Articulated vehicles and other vehicle trailer combinations over 11 metres but not more than 13 metres long may fit either type of markings so as to enable some variation in the length of the towing vehicle.

These Regulations will not apply to public service vehicles, caravans the unladen weight of which does not exceed 2 tons, vehicles brought temporarily into Northern Ireland, car transporters and certain other specialised vehicles.
