THE EUROPEAN COMMISSION AND COURT OF HUMAN RIGHTS (IMMUNITIES AND PRIVILEGES) ORDER 1970 (Article 1(2))

Parts I and II of the above Order came into operation on 24th February, 1971, the date when the Fourth Protocol to the General Agreement on Privileges and Immunities of the Council of Europe, 1961 entered into force with respect to the United Kingdom.

AGRICULTURAL MARKETING ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND) 1964

2. The directors of P.M.B. (Investments) Ltd., shall consist of:
 - (i) two who shall be appointed by the Pigs Marketing Board with the approval of the Minister;
 - (ii) two who shall be appointed by the Minister with the approval of the Pigs Marketing Board;
 - (iii) one full-time Executive Director to be appointed by the other directors.
3. The Chairman of P.M.B. (Investments) Ltd., shall be appointed by the Pigs Marketing Board and shall be a person with wide business and financial experience in industry or commerce.
4. No member of the Pigs Marketing Board may be a director of P.M.B. (Investments) Ltd., or of any company in which the Board has investments in processing.
