THE MINISTRY OF HOME AFFAIRS FOR NORTHERN IRELAND.

TOWN OF WHITEHEAD.

17 & 18 Vic., c. 103.

WHEREAS the town of Whitehead is a town having Commissioners under the Towns Improvement (Ireland) Act, 1854, and is situated in and forms part of the rural district of Larne, the Union of Larne, and the adminstrative county of Antrim:

And whereas the Ministry of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland (in this Order referred to as "the Ministry") has received a petition from local government electors within the said town of Whitehead praying that the said town may be separated from the rural district of Larne and be constituted an urban sanitary district:

And whereas the Ministry has caused a local inquiry to be made as to the propriety of assenting to the prayer of the said petition, and it appears to the Ministry to be proper to assent thereto:

Now, therefore, the Ministry, in exercise of the powers vested in it by section seven of the Public Health (Ireland) Act, 1878, and by certain enactments in the Local Government Acts (Northern Ireland), 1898 to 1924, and of all other powers enabling it, hereby orders and directs as follows:—

1. (1) The provisions of the following articles of this Order shall come into operation on the first day of April, nineteen hundred and twenty-seven, unless within three months from the date on which this Order is published in the "Belfast Gazette," the Ministry receives a petition against the Order from at least one-fourth of the local government electors within the town of White-

head or from the Board of Guardians of the Larne Union or from the Council of the Larne rural district.

- (2) If any such petition is so received by the Ministry as aforesaid, and this Order is confirmed by Parliament, the provisions of the following articles of this Order shall come into operation on the first day of April or first day of October next after such confirmation, whichever is the earlier date.
- (3) If any such petition, having been so received by the Ministry as aforesaid, is withdrawn before the tenth day of December, nineteen hundred and twenty-six, the foregoing provisions of this article shall have effect in like manner as if the petition had not been received.
- 2. The town of Whitehead shall be separated from the rural district of Larne in the administrative county of Antrim, and shall be constituted an urban sanitary district (hereinafter called "the urban district of Whitehead"), subject to the provisions of the Public Health (Ireland) Acts, 1878 to 1918, as amended by the provisions of the Local Government Acts (Northern Ireland), 1898 to 1924, affecting sanitary districts.
- 3. There shall be transferred to the urban sanitary authority of the urban district of Whitehead (in this Order referred to as "the urban district council"):—
 - (a) The business of the rural district council of Larne in relation to public works as defined by the Local Government (Ireland) Act, 1898, so far as respects the area of the said urban districts;
 - (b) The business of the county council of the administrative county of Antrim (so far as respects the area of the said urban district)

in relation to public works as so defined, the expense of the maintenance of which is not wholly or partly leviable off the county at large;

Nothing in this article shall prejudice the application for or making of any Order under the proviso to sub-section (4) of section one of the Local Government (Roads) Act (Northern Ireland), 1923, for determining that contributions should be made by way of adjustment to or by the said county council or the urban district council.

- 4. Any sum which is applicable by the county council of the adminstrative county of Antrim (hereinafter referred to as "the county council") to the relief of any agricultural land within the boundaries of the urban district of Whitehead from rates shall be paid to the urban district council in exchange for an adequate exemption of the said land from rates.
- 5. Any adjustment of property rights and liabilities which may become necessary for the full and effectual carrying out of this Order shall be made as between the urban district council and the county council, or as between the urban district council and the rural district council of Larne, or as between the urban district council and the board of guardians of the Larne Union, or as between the urban district council and any other persons whatsoever in manner provided by article thirty of the schedule to the Local Government (Application of Enactments) Order, 1898: provided that a duly certified copy of every adjustment or award made in pursuance of this article shall be deposited by the clerk of the urban district council at the office of the Ministry within one month from the date on which the same is finally made.
- 6. The urban district council shall be exempt from contributing to the following county-at-large charges of the administrative county of Antrim, namely:—
 - (a) Salaries, pensions and other expenses of officers other than the secretary-of the county council employed in the offices of the said secretary;
 - (b) Salaries, pensions and expenses of the deputy surveyor, assistant surveyors, and of officers other than the county surveyor employed in the offices of the county surveyor;
 - (c) Expenses of printing books and forms other than printing arranged for under subsection (2) of section ninety-six of the Local Government (Ireland) Act, 1898;
 - (d) Expenses of publication of notices and documents not directly affecting the urban district;
 - (e) Expenses of improvement and repairs to premises or portions of premises used solely as offices of the county council;
 - (f) Cost of legal advice and other law costs incurred in respect of matters not directly affecting the urban district;
 - (g) Remuneration and expenses of collectors of Poor Rate, including all expenses on account of the superannuation or compensation of those collectors (other than compensation under Article 7 of this Order); and
 - (h) Fees for the audit of the accounts of the County Council.

7. If by reason of the constitution of the Urban District of Whitehead any officer of the County Council suffers any direct pecuniary loss by abolition of office or by diminution or loss of fees or salary, he shall be entitled to have compensation paid to him for such pecuniary loss by the Urban District Council, and section one hundred and twenty of the Local Government Act, 1888, shall apply accordingly with the substitution of the Urban District Council for the County Council, and of the Ministry of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland for the Treasury.

Provided that this Article shall not apply to any officer of the County Council who receives an allowance or gratuity under section eight of the Local Government (Ireland) Act, 1919, as amended by section sixty-eight of the Government of Ireland Act, 1920, in respect of his removal from office by reason of the constitution of the Urban District of Whitehead.

- 8. The costs and expenses of the petitioners for this Order (so far as the same may be allowed by the Ministry) and of the Ministry incurred in respect of the application for preparation and making of this Order, and of the confirmation, if necessary, of this Order by Parliament, shall be paid by the Urban District Council out of and by means of the rates leviable by them under the Towns Improvement (Ireland) Act, 1854, as amended by the Public Health (Ireland) Acts, 1878 to 1918, and the Local Government Acts (Northern Ireland), 1898 to 1924.
- 9. This Order may be cited as the Whitehead Urban District Order, 1926.
