The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, by virtue of the powers conferred on them by section 13 of the Hydrocarbon Oil (Customs and Excise) Act 1971(a), and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf, hereby make the following Order:

1.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Hydrocarbon Oil Duties (Drawback) (No. 1) Order 1971.

(2) The Interpretation Act 1889(b) shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

(3) This Order shall come into operation on 4th August, 1971.

2. The Hydrocarbon Oil Duties (Drawback) No. 1) Order 1967 (c) is hereby revoked.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This Order revokes a Drawback Order which has become superfluous as the result of the relief from Hydrocarbon oil duty granted by section 7 of the Hydrocarbon Oil (Customs and Excise) Act 1971 in respect of oil used in the manufacture or preparation of certain articles.

SUPREME COURT, NORTHERN IRELAND

RULES OF THE SUPREME COURT (NORTHERN IRELAND) (No. 3) 1971

Procedure

Notice is hereby given that on 9th July, 1971, the Northern Ireland Supreme Court Rules Committee in exercise of the powers conferred by section 7 of the Northern Ireland Act 1962, made the Rules of the Supreme Court (Northern Ireland) (No. 3) 1971, S. R. & O. (N.I.) 1971 No. 219.

These rules amend the Rules of the Supreme Court (Northern Ireland) 1936 to provide for an increase from 4 per cent to 7 per cent per annum in the rate of interest on judgments or orders for the recovery of money.

The rules also enable the Court to appoint an official liquidator without requiring him to give security.
