The Sprucefield-Newry-Land Frontier Trunk Road Proposed Loughbrickland By-Pass

 - roads to connect the portion of trunk road which will be detrunked to the new road;

 - c. a road to connect the Rathfriland Road (B3) to the trunk road;
- (iii) to stop up wholly the junctions between:
 a. certain lengths of the trunk road and the new road;

- b. the new road and the Rathfriland Road (B3):
- c. the trunk road and the Poyntzpass Road (C344);

d. certain lengths of the trunk road.
