a Bank Holiday and a Public Holiday in  
Northern Ireland*

I, Ralph Francis Alnwick, Baron Grey of Naunton, Knight Grand Cross of The Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Knight Commander of The Royal Victorian Order, Officer of The Most Excellent Order of the British Empire, Governor of Northern Ireland, by and with the advice of the Privy Council of Northern Ireland in pursuance of the Banking and Financial Dealings Act 1971, the Irish Free State (Consequential Provisions) Act 1922, and of every power me thereunto enabling Do Hereby Appoint Wednesday the Twelfth day of July 1972 as a special Day to be observed as a Bank Holiday and as a Public Holiday in Northern Ireland, under and in accordance with the said Act and powers, and I do by this Proclamation command the said day to be so observed, and all loving subjects of Her Majesty to order themselves accordingly.

The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that they have made an Order under Section 6 of the Income and Corporation Taxes Act 1970(A).

Viz: The Income Tax (Small Maintenance Payments) Order 1972.

Section 65, Income and Corporation Taxes Act 1970. provides that income tax is not to be deducted

at source from certain weekly or monthly payments (called "small maintenance payments") payable under the order of a court in the United Kingdom for the maintenance of a party to a broken marriage or for the benefit, maintenance or education of a person under 21. As the law stands small maintenance payments must be payable weekly at a rate not exceeding £7.50 or monthly at a rate not exceeding £32.50. This Order increases those limits to £12 and £52 respectively. It applies to all payments under orders made after 5th April, 1972, to payments under orders varied or revived after that date which fall due after the variation or revival, and otherwise to payments falling due after 5th April, 1973 under orders in force at 5th April, 1972.

The Order comes into operation on 6th April, 1972 and has been published as Statutory Instruments 1972 No. 436.

The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that they have made an Order under Section 32(1) of the Finance Act 1966.

Viz: The Transitional Relief for Interest and Royalties paid to Non-Residents (Extension of Period) Order 1971.

This Order extends by one year the period during which relief is available under Section 32, Finance Act 1966. This section ensures that certain payments to non-residents which are relieved from United Kingdom income tax under a Double Taxation Agreement are not treated as distributions for corporation tax purposes in the hands of the United Kingdom company making them. The relief was originally given for the financial years 1966, 1967, 1968, 1970 and 1971 but provision was made in subsection 1 of the section for the extension of this period.

The Order came into operation on 1st April, 1972, and has been published as Statutory Instruments 1972 No. 464.

The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that they have made an Order under Section 31(1) of the Finance Act 1966.

Viz: The Non Residents' Transitional Relief from Income Tax on Dividends (Extension of Period) Order 1972.

This Order extends by one year the period during which relief is available under section 31, Finance Act 1966. This section gives relief from United Kingdom income tax on dividends paid by United Kingdom companies to residents of the overseas territories with which the United Kingdom has the Double Taxation Agreements listed in Schedule 9 to the same Act. The relief was originally given for the years 1966-67, 1967-68, 1968-69, 1969-70, 1970-71 and 1971-72 but provision was made in subsection 1 of the section for the extension of this period.

The Order came into operation on 6th April, 1972, and has been published as Statutory Instruments 1972 No. 465.
