ROADS ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND) 1948

The Classification of Roads (No. 2) Order (Northern Ireland) 1972

- (1) To classify as a first class road a length of some 867 linear yards of the route A29 (Garvagh to Coleraine) in the townlands of Killykergan and Inshaleen following realignment;
- (2) to cause a length of some 600 linear yards (former A29) in the townlands of Killykergan and Inshaleen (now superseded) to cease to be a classified road.

TRUNK ROAD IMPROVEMENT AT DAIRY LOUGH, CO. DOWN

The Ministry of Development hereby gives notice, in accordance with the provisions of the First Schedule to the Roads Act (Northern Ireland) 1948, that it proposes to make an Order under Sections 1 and 3 of the Act directing that:

1. a length of approximately 2.4 miles of new road, to be constructed in the townlands of Creevytenant, Glasdrumman and Ballynahinch, shall become part of the trunk road T2; and
2. two lengths of the existing trunk road totalling approximately 1.5 miles, which will be superseded by the above-mentioned new road, shall, from the first day of April after the date on which the new road is opened to through traffic, cease to be part of the trunk road.

The proposed Order will also authorise the Ministry:

- i. to improve the junction between the Creevytenant Road (DR112) and the new road in the townland of Creevytenant;
- ii. to construct the following connecting roads:
 - (a) a road to connect a portion of trunk road which will be superseded, to the new road in the townland of Creevytenant, near the junction described at i. above;
 - (b) a road to connect a portion of trunk road which will be superseded, to the new road in the townland of Glasdrumman, approximately 150 yards north of the junction between Blacks Lane (DR111) and the existing trunk road;

- (c) a road to connect the new road to the first-class road A21 in the townland of Glasdrumman, approximately 130 yards south-west of Glasdrumman Orange Hall;
 - (d) a road to connect the first-class road A21 to the new road in the townland of Ballynahinch, approximately 265 yards north-east of its existing junction with the trunk road;
 - (e) a road to connect a portion of the trunk road which will be superseded, to the new road in the townland of Ballynahinch, 50 yards north of the existing junction between the trunk road and the first-class road A21.
- iii. To stop up wholly the road junctions between:
- (a) certain lengths of the existing trunk road and the new road in the townland of Creevytenant;
 - (b) the new road and the first-class road A21 in the townland of Ballynahinch and
 - (c) two lengths of the existing trunk road in the townland of Ballynahinch.

The proposals are delineated on a map which, together with a copy of the draft Order, may be inspected by any person at all reasonable hours during the period from 30th June, 1972 to 7th August, 1972 at the offices of the Secretary, Down County Council, Court House, Downpatrick, or of the Ministry, Room 412, Stormont, Belfast BT4 3SS.
