In exercise of our powers under Section 22 of the Finance Act, 1921, the Government of Ireland Act, 1920, and all other powers in this behalf enabling Us, and without prejudice to the further exercise of those powers, We, the Ministry of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland, hereby order as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Road Vehicles (Part Year Licensing) (Northern Ireland) Order, 1922.
