To alter and modify the trusts and provisions of the Trust Deed and the Scheme of the year 1919; to dissolve the Body Corporate known as "The Governors of the Methodist College, Belfast"; to create a New Corporate Body to be called "The Governors of the Methodist College, Belfast''; to create a Corporate Body to be called "The Governors of the Edgehill Theological College, Belfast''; to apportion and segregate the lands, buildings, premises and other Endowments of the College to provide for the vesting of the apportioned and segregated parts as to one part in "The Governors of the Methodist College, Belfast," and as to the other part in "The Governors of the Edgehill Theological College, Belfast "; to provide for the qualification, appointment, retirement and disqualification of Governors; to provide for the alteration of the constitution of "The Governors of the Methodist College, Belfast," and of "The Governors of the Edgehill Theological College, Belfast"; to declare the trusts of and to provide for the application of the Endowments of the College; to declare the trusts of and to provide for the application of the Endowments of the Edgehill Theological College, Belfast; to make provision for the education, religious and secular, to be provided at each College, and matters incidental thereto; to make provision for the appointments of the Principals of each College, and for the appointments of the various other officers and servants of each College; to make provision for the Place of Worship in connection with both Colleges; to provide for board and residence at each College and matters incidental thereto; to define the powers of "The Governors of the Methodist College, Belfast," and of "The Governors of the Edgehill Theological College, and to make provision for their meetings and the methods by which their powers may be exercised; to give powers to each new Corporate Body for its general management and the management and control of its Endowments; to give powers to each new Corporate Body to make Bye-laws and Regulations; to provide for the powers of the Conference; to make provision for enabling the Conference

to alter, vary or annul the provisions of this intended Act; to make further provision for the alteration of the Act; to provide for the management and auditing of the accounts of both Colleges; to make provision for the vested interests of every person holding any office, place, employment, pension, compensation, allowance or emolument in or under "The Governors of the Methodist College, Belfast or the Endowments of the College; to authorise the Ministry of Finance for Northern Ireland to frame an amending scheme for the future government and management of the two Colleges and their Endowments; and generally to do all matters necessary and proper for the establishment of the Methodist College, Belfast, and the Edgehill Theological College, Belfast, and for the government, management and control of the same and of their several Endowments.
