ORDER.

WHEREAS, by Regulation 26 of the Regulations contained in the Schedule to the Civil Authorities (Special Powers) Act (Northern Ireland), 1922, it is provided that the Civil Authority may, by notice, prohibit the circulation of any newspaper for any specified period, and that any person circulating or distributing such newspaper within such specified period shall be guilty of an offence against the Regulations in the said Schedule.

And Whereas a newspaper, expressed to be printed for the Proprietors by the Mellifont Press, Limited, Dublin, and published at 31 Exchequer Street, Dublin, under the title "An Phoblacht," "The Republic," or "The Loyalist," or other alias, contains treasonable and seditious matter:

Now I, The Right Honourable Sir Richard Dawson Bates, Minister of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland, being the Civil Authority under the said Act, in exercise of the powers vested in me by the said Act and Regulations, Do Hereby Prohibit the circulation of the said newspaper entitled "An Phoblacht," "The Republic," or "The Loyalist," or under any other title or alias whatever in Northern Ireland from the 1st day of January, 1927, until the 31st day of December, 1927.
