EXPLOSIVES ACT 1875

Whereas by sub-section (1)(a) of section 1 of the Northern Ireland (Temporary Provisions) Act 1972 it is provided that so long as that section has effect all functions which apart from that Act belong to any Minister of Northern Ireland shall be discharged by the Secretary of State and by paragraph 2(1) of the Schedule to that Act it is provided that the Secretary of State may by Order appoint such persons as he sees fit to discharge any functions exercisable by him by virtue of Section 1(1) of that Act, other than as therein mentioned:

And whereas by the Discharge of Functions Order dated the 11th day of August, 1972, the Secretary of State appointed any person for the time being holding office as a Minister of State or Parliamentary Under Secretary of State in the Northern Ireland Office to discharge any functions exercisable by him by virtue of Section 1(1) of the Northern Ireland (Temporary Provisions) Act 1972 other than as therein mentioned:

Now therefore I, the Lord Windlesham, Minister of State, in virtue of the powers conferred on me by section 53 of the Explosives Act 1875 and of every other power enabling me in this behalf, do hereby appoint Sergeant Henry Edward Bell (No. 7260) of the Royal Ulster Constabulary as an Inspector for Northern Ireland under the said Act and do hereby direct him to exercise only such powers and to perform such duties under the Act as I shall from time to time assign to him.
