### CUSTODIAN OF EX-ENEMY PROPERTY FOR NORTHERN IRELAND.

In pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by the Trading with the Enemy Amendment Act, 1914 (5 Geo. 5, Ch. 12), the Board of Trade have appointed Mr. W. E. Maclatchy, Commissioner and Secretary, Land Purchase Commission, Belfast, to act as Custodian of Ex-Enemy Property for Northern Ireland, in succession to the late Mr. T. G. H. Green.

### TRADE BOARDS ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1923.

### LINEN AND COTTON HANDKERCHIEF AND HOUSEHOLD GOODS AND LINEN PIECE GOODS TRADE BOARD (NORTHERN IRELAND).

The Trade Board established by the Ministry of Labour for Northern Ireland under powers conferred by the Trade Boards Act (Northern Ireland), 1923, for the Linen and Cotton Handkerchief and Household Goods and Linen Piece Goods Trade in Northern Ireland hereby give notice that they have received notification, dated the 1st December, 1926, that the Ministry of Labour has made an Order, confirming minimum rates of wages as varied by the Trade Board as aforesaid, and specifying the third day of January, 1927, and the first day of February, 1927, as the dates from which they shall become effective.

On request to the Trade Board particulars of the minimum rates of wages above referred to

and information as to their application will be given if, in the opinion of the Trade Board, the applicant is likely to be affected thereby.

### SAFEGUARDING OF INDUSTRIES ACT, 1921, AS AMENDED BY SECTION 10 OF THE FINANCE ACT, 1926.

### LISTS OF ARTICLES CHARGEABLE WITH DUTY UNDER PART I.

*(Safeguarding of Key Industries).*

The Board of Trade make the following announcement:—

1. Section 1 (5) of the Safeguarding of Industries Act, 1921, provides that for the purpose of preventing disputes arising as to whether any goods are or are not chargeable with duty under Part I of the Act, the Board of Trade may from time to time issue lists defining the articles which are to be taken as falling under any of the general descriptions set out in the Schedule to the Act, and where any list is so issued defining the articles which are to be taken as falling under such general description, the said Schedule shall have effect as if the articles comprised in the list were therein substituted for that general description.

2. In pursuance of the foregoing provisions, lists prepared by the Board of Trade were

published in the London Gazette on 27th September, 1921, defining certain of the general descriptions set out in the Schedule.

3. The Board of Trade have prepared the accompanying additional lists which to the extent to which they add to the lists previously issued, are to be regarded as further defining the articles which are to be taken as falling under the following general descriptions in the Schedule to the Act, viz.:—

Optical glass and optical elements, whether finished or not. (See List A (ii)).

Optical instruments. (See List B (ii)).

Scientific glassware. (See List C (ii)).

Laboratory porcelain. (See List D (ii)).

Scientific instruments. (See List E (ii)).

Synthetic organic chemicals (other than synthetic organic dyestuffs, colours and colouring matters imported for use as such, and organic intermediate products imported for their manufacture) analytical re-agents, all other fine chemicals (except sulphate of quinine of vegetable origin) and chemicals manufactured by fermentation processes. (See List H (ii)).

4. Articles included in any of the accompanying lists will, subject to the provisions of the Safeguarding of Industries Act, 1921, be chargeable with duty under Part I of the Act, as amended, on and after the 15th January, 1927.

Synthetic organic dyestuffs, colours, and colouring matters and organic intermediate products used in the manufacture thereof are, however, liable to duty under Part I of the Safeguarding of Industries Act, 1921, when not exempted in the circumstances indicated above.

When any organic chemical in this list includes a simple or compound radical which is not qualified by mono, di, tri, tetra, etc., the list is to be read as including all forms of the chemical covered by the introduction of such qualifications of that radical.

When any organic chemical in this list includes a simple or compound radical which is

not qualified by ortho, meta, para, alpha, beta, iso, etc., the list is to be read as including all forms of the chemical covered by the introduction of such qualifications of that radical.

The list is to be read as also including the salts of any amino and other basic organic compounds named therein.

#### NOTICE OF APPLICATION FOR A SPECIAL ORDER UNDER SECTION 26 OF THE ELECTRICITY SUPPLY ACT, 1919.

The Urban District Council of Armagh, whose address is City Hall, Armagh (hereinafter called the Undertakers), hereby give notice that they intend making application to the Electricity Commissioners for Northern Ireland for a special Order for the following purposes:—

1. To authorise the Undertakers to generate supply and sell Electricity for all public and

private purposes as defined by the Electricity Supply Acts, 1882 to 1919, within the Urban District of Armagh and the townlands of Corporation, Mullynure, Longstone, Tully-  
 elmer, Lurgyvallen, Legarhill, Drumarg or Downs, Umgola, Parkmore or Demesne, Cavanacaw, Ballinahonemore, Drumadd and Killuney, in the Rural District of Armagh, in the County of Armagh, hereinafter referred to as the area of supply.

And after directing the payment of the expenses of keeping in good order the family burying-ground, Testatrix directed that the remainder of the interest and income from said Investment should be divided equally between the Stipend of the Minister of Second Dromara Presbyterian Congregation and the collection taken up in said Congregation annually for the Foreign Mission in connection with the General Assembly of the Presbyterian Church in Ireland, provided that if the annual contribution of the Congregation (exclusive of the portion of the interest and income therein mentioned) to the Stipend of the said Minister should for two successive years be less than the sum of £65 sterling per annum, Testatrix directed that the whole of the said remainder of the income from the said Investment should be paid and applied to the said Annual Collection for the said Foreign Mission. And Testatrix declared that the receipt of the Minister, Clerk of Session, and Treasurer, for the time being, of the said Congregation should be a good discharge to her Executors for payment of said Moneys.
