NOTICE OF APPLICATION FOR A SPECIAL ORDER UNDER SECTION 26 OF THE ELECTRICITY SUPPLY ACT, 1919.

The Urban District Council of Armagh, whose address is City Hall, Armagh (hereinafter called the Undertakers), hereby give notice that they intend making application to the Electricity Commissioners for Northern Ireland for a special Order for the following purposes:—

1. To authorise the Undertakers to generate supply and sell Electricity for all public and

private purposes as defined by the Electricity Supply Acts, 1882 to 1919, within the Urban District of Armagh and the townlands of Corporation, Mullynure, Longstone, Tully-
 elmer, Lurgyvallen, Legarhill, Drumarg or Downs, Umgola, Parkmore or Demesne, Cavanacaw, Ballinahonemore, Drumadd and Killuney, in the Rural District of Armagh, in the County of Armagh, hereinafter referred to as the area of supply.

2. To prescribe and limit the price to be charged for Electricity.

3. To use land situate in Dobbin Street, Armagh, within the Urban District of Armagh, at present used as a Poultry Market, for the purposes of an Electricity Generating Station.

4. The streets and parts of streets in which it is proposed that electric lines shall be laid down for the purposes of General Supply within a specified time are those named in the First Part of the Schedule hereto.

5. The roads not repairable by the Local Authority and the railways which the Undertakers propose to take powers to break up are named in the Second Part of the Schedule hereto.

6. The land which it is desired the said Order shall authorise the use of for the purposes of a Generating Station contains 360 square yards, or thereabouts, belonging to the Armagh Urban District Council, and it situate in Dobbin Street, Armagh, bounded on the North by Dobbin Street, on the South by land occupied by James Mullan, on the East by a house occupied by William Morrison, and on the West by Dobbin Street Lane, in the Urban District of Armagh, and County of Armagh.

Notice is hereby given that every local authority or other public authority, company or person, desirous of bringing before the Electricity Commissioners any objection respecting the application, may do so by registered letter addressed to the Secretary of the Electricity Commissioners, 13 Wellington Place, Belfast, and despatched within 30 days from the publication of this advertisement, and that a copy of such objection must also be forwarded to the undersigned Parliamentary Agent for the said Order.

Dobbin Street (both sides from Generating Station to Thomas Street), Ogle Street (both sides), Thomas Street (both sides), Scotch Street (both sides), Market Street (East side only), Russell Street (both sides) Upper English Street (both sides), Lower English Street (East side only).

Overhead Lines in—

Irish Street, Vicar's Hill, Navan Street, Primrose Hill, Callan Street, Dobbin Street (from
