The Civil Service Commissioners for Northern Ireland hereby give Notice that the following Regulations are published with the approval of the Ministry of Finance for Northern Ireland, viz.:—

REGULATIONS RESPECTING OPEN
COMPETITIONS FOR THE SITUATION
OF CLERK (MALE) IN THE CIVIL
SERVICE.

1. The limits of age are 17 and 19. If an examination begins in one of the first six months of any year, candidates must be of or over the age of 17 and under the age of 19 on the 31st day of March in that year. If an examination begins in one of the last six months of any year, candidates must be of or over the age of 17 and under the age of 19 on the 30th day of September in that year.

2. A candidate must be a natural-born British subject, and the son of a father also a natural-born British subject.

3. A fee of £1 will be required from each candidate applying to attend the examination.
