The Post Office by virtue of the powers conferred upon it by section 28 of the Post Office Act 1969, and of all other powers enabling it in this behalf, hereby makes the following Scheme:

## Commencement, citation and interpretation

1.-(1) This Scheme shall come into operation on the 24th day of June, 1974, and may be cited as the Post Office Overseas Letter Post Amendment (No. 7) Scheme 1974.
