MISUSE OF DRUGS ACT 1971 SECTION 12(2)

Direction prohibiting exercise of powers in relation to controlled drugs

PHILIP MATHEWS GOODRICH

In accordance with section 12(2) of the Misuse of Drugs Act 1971, notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State

gave the following direction which was served and thereby came into effect on 14th August, 1974:

Whereas Philip Mathews Goodrich, M.R.C.P., L.R.C.P., D.R.C.O.G., whose registered address is 56 High Street, Steyning, Sussex, is a doctor who has been convicted of an offence under the Misuse of Drugs Act 1971:

Now therefore, in pursuance of section 12(2) of the Misuse of Drugs Act 1971, I, The Rt. Hon. Roy Jenkins, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, by this direction prohibit the said Philip Mathews Goodrich from having in his possession, prescribing, administering, manufacturing, compounding and supplying and from authorising the administration and supply of the substances and products specified in the schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE

1. Amphetamine, dexamphetamine, methylamphetamine, methylphenidate and phenmetrazine.
2. Any stereoisomeric form of a substance specified in paragraph 1 above.
3. Any salt of a substance specified in paragraph 1 or 2 above.
4. Any preparation or other product containing a substance or product specified in any of paragraphs 1 to 3 above.

DEPARTMENT OF THE ENVIRONMENT

The Department of the Environment for Northern Ireland has made Regulations under sections 88 and 189 of the Road Traffic Act (Northern Ireland) 1970 entitled the Motor Vehicles (Third Party Risks) (Amendment) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1974 (S.R. No. 207). The Regulations came into force on 13th August, 1974.

Regulation 8 of the Motor Vehicles (Third Party Risks) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1972, provides that where a constable requires the production of evidence of insurance under section 156 of the Road Traffic Act (Northern Ireland) 1970 there may be produced, in the case of a vehicle normally based in an EEC country other than the United Kingdom and Gibraltar, a document issued by the insurer of the vehicle showing certain particulars of the insurance, instead of an insurance certificate. These Regulations amend Regulation 8 so as to apply the provision mentioned above in relation to vehicles normally based in Austria, Finland, Norway, Sweden or Switzerland.

The Department of the Environment for Northern Ireland has made Regulations under section 2 of the European Communities Act 1972 and the European Communities (Designation) Order 1972 entitled the European Communities (Motor Vehicles: Compulsory Insurance) (Amendment) (Northern Ireland) Regulations 1974 (S.R. No. 206). The Regulations came into operation on 13th August 1974.

These Regulations amend the European Communities (Motor Vehicles: Compulsory Insurance) (Northern Ireland) Regulations 1973 (which make provision for the extension of compulsory motor vehicle insurance cover under Part V of the Road Traffic Act (Northern Ireland) 1970 to include liabilities arising out of the use of a motor vehicle or trailer which are compulsorily insurable in the territories of member states of the European Communities). The effect of the principal amendments is:

- (a) that vehicles normally based in any of the countries specified in Regulation 2 (which are not member states of the Communities) are exempted from the need to produce evidence of insurance when entering Northern Ireland (Regulation 5);
- (b) that certain vehicles which, not having proper insurance on entering Northern Ireland, have been detained for that reason, may be released where the detaining authority is satisfied that the vehicle in question is to be taken out of Northern Ireland to a place not in one of the countries referred to above (Regulation 7); and
- (c) that the requirements of the 1970 Act that insurance policies must be issued by authorised insurers and that they are of no effect unless certificates are issued shall not apply in respect of policies issued elsewhere than in the United Kingdom for vehicles normally based in any of the said countries (Regulation 8).

Argentine: Official Certificate

The Department of Health and Social Services with the approval of the Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food gives notice that in exercise of the powers conferred on it by the Imported Food (Northern Ireland) Regulations 1968 it hereby recognises, subject to the conditions hereinafter set out, the Official Certificates of which particulars are given in the First and Second Schedules hereto as showing:

- (a) that the meat to which they relate or the meat from which the meat product to which they relate was prepared, was derived from mammals inspected before and after death in the country of origin of the meat and passed in accordance with criteria satisfactory to the Department and
- (b) that the dressing, packing and other preparation of the meat or the meat product was carried out with all necessary precautions for the prevention of danger to health.

The said Certificates are recognised subject to the following conditions:

- (i) This recognition applies to meat and meat products imported from the Argentine Republic, but does not apply to any such meat or meat product derived from mammals killed when wild.
- (ii) Where the Official Certificates are in the form of labels, the recognition will apply only if the labels are securely affixed to the meat or the meat product or the package containing the meat or the meat product, and if the labels have not in any other circumstances or on any other occasion been used as Official Certificates.
- (iii) Where the Official Certificates are in the form of stamps, the recognition will apply only if the stamps are clearly impressed or otherwise marked on the meat or the meat product or the package containing the meat or the meat product.
- (iv) Recognition of the Official Certificate is restricted to those completed by the insertion of one of the establishment numbers currently approved by the Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food.

The Notice published in the Belfast Gazette dated 25th August, 1972, will remain in force until 30th April, 1975, from which date it is hereby revoked.
