BY HIS GRACE THE GOVERNOR AND PRIVY COUNCIL OF NORTHERN IRELAND.

A PROCLAMATION.

For appointing Tuesday, July 12th, 1927, a Bank Holiday and a Public Holiday in Northern Ireland.

ABERCORN.

I, James Albert Edward, Duke of Abercorn, Governor of Northern Ireland, by and with the advice of the Privy Council of Northern Ireland in pursuance of the Bank Holidays Act, 1871, the Holidays Extension Act, 1875, and the Irish Free State (Consequential Provisions) Act, 1922, and of every power Me thereunto enabling, Do Hereby Appoint Tuesday, the Twelfth day of July, next, as a special day to be observed as a Bank Holiday and as a Public Holiday in Northern Ireland, under and in accordance with the said Acts, and I do, by this Proclamation command the said day to be so observed, and all loving subjects of His Majesty to order themselves accordingly.

Given at the Council Chamber, Government House, Hillsborough, this 19th day of May in the year of our Lord, One Thousand Nine Hundred and Twenty-Seven.

WHEREAS by Clause 3 of an Order made by the Governor of Northern Ireland, dated the 11th day of July, 1923, it was provided that the qualifications of all persons proposed to be appointed to any situation in the Civil service of Northern Ireland should, before those persons were appointed, be approved by the Civil Service Commissioners for Northern Ireland, and that no person should be so appointed until a certificate of his qualifications had been issued by the said Commissioners:

And Whereas it was laid down in proviso (a) to the said Clause that the foregoing provision should not apply to any of the situations specified in the Schedule to the said Order:

And Whereas the said Schedule included (amongst other situations) all situations in a Department filled in the customary course of promotion by persons previously serving in that Department, and all temporary situations.

And Whereas it was further laid down in proviso (b) to the said Clause that it should not be necessary for any person who at the date of the Order held a certificate of qualification from the Civil Service Commission of the United Kingdom to obtain a new certificate of qualification from the Civil Service Commissioners for Northern Ireland on being appointed either by transfer or promotion to a situation which, in the opinion of the lastmentioned Commissioners, was similar to the situation in respect of which he already held a certificate or might properly be filled in customary course of promotion from the class or grade of situation in respect of which the existing certificate was issued:

And Whereas it is expedient that the said Order shall have effect with certain alterations in the description of the situations included in the Schedule thereto as aforesaid and with the substitution of a new proviso for proviso (b) to Clause 3.

Now, Therefore, I, James Albert Edward, Duke of Abercorn, Governor of Northern Ireland, hereby order as follows:—

- 1. Paragraphs 3 and 4 of the Schedule to the said Order shall be omitted, and the following paragraph shall be substituted therefor:—
 - "3. All unestablished or temporary situations."
- 2. The following proviso shall be substituted for proviso (b) to Clause 3 of the said Order:
 - "(b) it shall not be necessary for any person to whom at any time a certificate of qualification has been issued by the Commissioners or by the Civil Service Commission of the United Kingdom and who holds any situation, being either a situation in respect of which such certificate was issued, or any other situation to which he was duly transferred or promoted from such last-mentioned situation without a certificate of qualification, to obtain a new certificate on being appointed either by transfer or promotion to a situation which, in the opinion of the Commissioners
 - (i) is similar to his existing situation or can ordinarily be filled by way of promotion from that situation, and
 - (ii) does not call for the possession of any special qualifications which could not have been acquired in the course of his employment."
- 3. The said Order, dated the 11th July, 1923, shall have effect, and shall be deemed always to have had effect as amended by this Order.

THE PUBLIC HEALTH ACTS NORTHERN IRELAND), 1878-1925.

LISBURN RURAL DISTRICT.

MERCHANDISE MARKS ACT, 1926.

THE MERCHANDISE MARKS EXEMPTION DIRECTION (No. 1), 1927, DATED MAY 16, 1927, MADE BY THE BOARD OF TRADE UNDER SECTION 1, Sub-section (3), of the Merchandise Marks ACT, 1926, 16 & 17 GEO. 5, c. 53).

WHEREAS the Merchandise Marks Act, 1926 (16 & 17 Geo. 5, c. 53), Section 1, provides that it shall not be lawful to sell, or expose for sale, or, by way of advertising goods of some other kind, distribute, in the United Kingdom, any imported goods to which there is applied any name or trade mark being, or purporting to be, the name or trade mark of any manufacturer, dealer or trader or the name of any place or district in the United Kingdom, unless the name or trade mark is accompanied by an indication of origin.

And Whereas Sub-section (3) of the said Section 1 provides that if the Board of Trade are satisfied after considering such representations (if any) as may be made to them by any persons appearing to the Board of Trade to have a substantial interest in the matter, that, having regard to the special circumstances of the trade, difficulties would arise if the said Section 1 applied to goods of any class or description, or goods sold under any particular designation, and that public interests in the United Kingdom would not be materially prejudiced by exempting such goods from the operation of the said Section 1, they may direct that the said Section 1 shall not apply to such goods, or that goods shall not be treated as falling under the said Section 1 by reason only that they are so designated.

Now, therefore, the Board of Trade, having considered representations made to them in that behalf by persons appearing to the Board to have a substantial interest in the matter and being satisfied that, having regard to the special circumstances of the trade, difficulties would arise if the said Section I applied to Petroleum and Liquid Products thereof, and that public interests in the United Kingdom would not be materially prejudiced by exempting Petroleum and Liquid Products thereof from the operation of the said Section 1, hereby direct in pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by the said Sub-section (3) as

 Section 1 of the Merchandise Marks Act, 1926, shall not apply to Petroleum and Liquid Products thereof.

2. This direction may be cited as the Exemption Direction Merchandise Marks (No. 1), 1927.

MERCHANDISE MARKS ACT, 1926. Uncompounded Drugs.

PROPOSED EXEMPTION FROM SECTION 1.

The Board of Trade, having considered representations which have been made to them by persons appearing to the Board to have a substantial interest in the matter, hereby give Notice of their intention to direct, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by Section 1, Sub-section (3) of the Merchandise Marks Act, 1926, that Section 1 shall not apply to Uncompounded Drugs which after importation are packed or otherwise put up in the United Kingdom for sale. The proposed Directions will, however, not extend to drugs sold or exposed for sale in the original inner receptacles in which they were imported, or to any article sold or exposed for sale under a proprietary name.

Any communication on the subject of the above proposed Direction should be addressed within fourteen days from the date of this notice to the Secretary, Board of Trade, Great George Street, Westminster, London, S.W.1.
