CLEAN AIR ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND) 1964
ANTRIM (NO. 4) SMOKE CONTROL ORDER 1974
(VARIATION) ORDER (NORTHERN IRELAND) 1975

1. Notice is hereby given that the Antrim District Council in exercise of the powers conferred on them by Section 11 of the above-mentioned Act on the 13th day of

March, 1975, made an Order entitled the Antrim (No. 4) Smoke Control Order 1974 (Variation) Order (Northern Ireland) 1975. The Antrim District Council (No. 4) Smoke Control Order (Northern Ireland) 1974 is hereby varied as follows:

In Part I of the schedule the reference to the premises No. 29 Massereene Street shall be deleted and the said premises shall cease to be exempt from the said Order. This Order is about to be submitted to the Department of the Environment for confirmation.

2. Subject to the limitations and exemptions provided by the Order and by virtue of Section 11 of the Act if, on any day after the Order has come into operation, smoke is emitted from a chimney of any building within the smoke control area the occupier of that building shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a fine not exceeding £20 unless he proves that the emission of smoke was not caused by the use of any fuel other than an authorised fuel. The authorised fuels include anthracite, coke and other carbonised fuels, gas and electricity.
3. Copies of the Orders, and of the Map referred to therein may be inspected free of charge at the Council Offices, Steeple, Antrim, at all reasonable times during the period of six weeks from the fifth day of June, 1975.
4. Within the said period any person who will be affected by the Order may by Notice in writing to the Secretary, Department of the Environment, Stormont, Belfast BT4 3SS, object to the confirmation of the Order.

The amendments to the Standing Orders provide for a copy of a Private Bill extending to Northern Ireland to be deposited at the Northern Ireland Office in Great George Street, London, and for the Promoters to make available for inspection, and for sale at a reasonable price, copies of a Bill at an office in Belfast.

DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND SOCIAL SECURITY

MEDICINES ACT 1968

European Pharmacopoeia

On behalf of the Secretaries of State respectively concerned with health in England, Scotland and in Wales and on behalf of the Head of the Department of Health and Social Services for Northern Ireland it is hereby declared under section 65 (7) of the Medicines Act 1968, that on and after July 1, 1975, the following Amendments to the volume of the European Pharmacopoeia published in 1971 (Volume II), under the direction of the Council of Europe (Partial Agreement) in accordance with the Convention on the Elaboration of a European Pharmacopoeia, are to have effect for the purposes of section 65 of that Act.

Vaccinum influenzae adsorbatum

Volume II, page 404. Replace the first paragraph by the following: "Influenza Vaccine (Adsorbed) is a sterile aqueous suspension of inactivated influenza virus to which aluminium hydroxide, aluminium oxide, aluminium phosphate or calcium phosphate has been added. These adjuvants are precipitated in special conditions which confer the appropriate physical form and adsorptive properties."

Vaccinum typhoidi

Volume II, page 421. Replace the first paragraph by the following: "Typhoid Vaccine is a suspension of killed *Salmonella typhi* containing not less than 500 million and not more than 1000 million bacteria (*S. typhi*) per human dose, the human dose being contained in not more than 1.0 ml of the vaccine."

Tests Before "Sterility . . ." insert: "Phenol (Volume II, page 39). Not more than 0.5 per cent w/v."

Volume II, page 402. Tests Before "Sterility . . ." insert: "Phenol (Volume II, page 39). Not more than 0.5 per cent w/v."

The Department of the Environment for Northern Ireland has made a Statutory Rule entitled Motor Vehicle Testing Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1975 (S.R. 1975 No. 138).

The regulations which come into operation on 1st June, 1975, make provision for the testing of cars and motor cycles for the purpose of ascertaining whether they comply with the requirements of the regulations relating to the construction and use of motor vehicles. The main provisions are:

1. An application should be made at least one month before the certificate is required and be accompanied by the appropriate fee.

2. The vehicle should be presented for testing in a road-worthy and reasonably clean condition.
3. If a certificate is refused an appeal may be lodged within 14 days together with the appropriate fee and a further test will be carried out.
4. A vehicle must be removed from a test centre before the end of the day on which the test is completed.
5. Vehicles exempted from the test are listed.
6. A test certificate must be produced on application for a vehicle excise licence.
