NOTICE FROM SCOTTISH DEPARTMENT

HERRING INDUSTRY BOARD

Direction No. 2/75

The Herring Industry Board by virtue of the powers vested in them by the Herring Industry Scheme 1951, hereby make the following Direction:

Between the 1st day of July and the 27th day of September 1975 (both dates inclusive) no person shall sell or buy herring on a first sale at sea nor transport herring to

land and sell on a first sale at places in the Shetland Islands other than Lerwick, Scalloway or Heogan Pier on the island of Bressay; provided that this Direction shall not apply in respect of herring landed for processing ashore at any other place in the Shetland Islands up to a maximum of 18 units of 100 kg. by any one boat on any one day.

For the purpose of this Direction "to land" shall mean discharge on to a quay or on to a vessel.
