CIVIL BILL COURTS, NORTHERN IRELAND.

FEES IN WORKMEN'S COMPENSATION CASES.

Made by the Lord Chief Justice of Northern Ireland with the concurrence of His Honour the Recorder of Belfast County Court Judge and Chairman of Antrim and His Honour the County Court Judge and Chairman of the County of Down with the consent of the Ministry of Finance (Northern Ireland), pursuant to the County Officers and Courts (Ireland) Act, 1877, the County Officers and Courts Act (Northern Ireland), 1925, and the Workmen's Compensation (Miscellaneous Amendments) Act (Northern Ireland), 1927.

WHEREAS by Section 83 of "The County Officers and Courts (Ireland) Act, 1877," it is provided that the Lord Chancellor, with the concurrence of the Chairman or any five of them to be selected or nominated as in the said Act provided, and with the consent of the Treasury may by Order fix the fees to be taken in the Civil Bill Courts in respect of any business under that or any other Acts in force for the time being in such Courts, and may, with the like concurrence and consent, alter, reduce or increase the same from time to time, and may also, with the like concurrence and consent, alter the fees and Stamp Duties taken in those Courts and substitute other fees for the same:

And whereas under and in pursuance of the provisions of the Government of Ireland Act, 1920, and the Orders made by His Majesty in Council thereunder, the references in the said Section to the Lord Chancellor shall be construed as references to the Lord Chief Justice of Northern Ireland, and the references

to the Treasury shall be construed as references to the Ministry of Finance for Northern Ireland:

And whereas by the County Officers and Courts Act (Northern Ireland), 1925, Section 10, the concurrence required in connection with the making by the Lord Chief Justice of Northern Ireland of Rules or Orders under Section eighty-three of the County Officers and Courts (Ireland) Act, 1877, shall be the concurrence of the Chairmen within the meaning of the said Act, or any two of them, to be nominated by the said Lord Chief Justice:

And whereas by Order dated 1st day of February, 1926, the Right Honourable William Moore, Lord Chief Justice of Northern Ireland, made pursuant to the provisions of Section 10 of the said County Officers and Courts Act (Northern Ireland), 1925, did nominate His Honour Herbert Thompson, Recorder of Belfast, County Court Judge and Chairman of Antrim, and His Honour Arthur Henry Bates, County Court Judge and Chairman of the County of Down to be the two Chairmen whose concurrence with the Lord Chief Justice of Northern Ireland in the making of Rules or Orders and in framing of Scales of Fees, Costs and Charges under the said County Officers and Courts Act, 1877, should be necessary and sufficient:

And Whereas by Order dated 26th day of February, 1926, the Right Honourable William Moore, Lord Chief Justice of Northern Ireland, with the concurrence of His Honour Herbert Thompson, Recorder of Belfast and County Court Judge and Chairman of the County of Antrim, and of His Honour Arthur Henry Bates, County Court Judge and Chairman of the County of Down, and with the consent of the Ministry of Finance for

Northern Ireland, did thereby fix the fees set out in the Schedule to the said Order as the fees to be taken in the Civil Bill Courts in Northern Ireland on and after the 1st day of May 1, 1926, in respect of any business under the County Officers and Courts (Ireland) Act, 1877, and under any other Acts in force for the time being in such Courts:

And Whereas by Section 1 of the Workmen's Compensation (Miscellaneous Amendments) Act (Northern Ireland), 1927, it is provided that (1) no Court fee shall be payable by the workman in respect of proceedings in a Court under the Workmen's Compensation Act, 1906, and that (2) subject to the provisions of Subsection (1) the words "without fee" in paragraph (9) of the second Schedule to the said Workmen's Compensation Act, 1906, and paragraph (13) of the said Schedule shall cease to have effect:

Now I, the Right Honourable William Moore, Lord Chief Justice of Northern Ireland, with the concurrence of His Honour Herbert Thompson, Recorder of Belfast and County Court Judge and Chairman of the County of Antrim, and of His Honour Arthur Henry Bates, County Court Judge and Chairman of the County of Down, and with the consent of the Ministry of Finance, do hereby order that on and after the date of this Order for the word "party" in line one of Part IV of the Schedule to the said Order of 26th day of February, 1926, the word "workman" shall be substituted.

POST OFFICE REGISTER REGULATIONS, 1925—AMENDMENT OF REGULATION 13.

The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury have in conjunction with the Postmaster-General made the following Provisional Regulations dated the 15th July, 1927, under the Act 5 and 6 Geo. V, c. 93, amending Regulation 13 of the Post Office Register Regulations, 1925, dated August 7th, 1925 (S.R. and O., 1925, No. 788):—

(1) The following shall be substituted for paragraph (1) of Regulation 13 of the Post Office Register Regulations, 1925:—

"(1) Subject to the terms of the prospectus relating to the issue of any stock on the register and subject as hereinafter provided, the holder of any stock or securities on the books of the Bank of England or of the Bank of Ireland may, if the stock or securities is or are of a description corresponding to any stock of that issue, exchange that stock or those securities for stock on the register of a corresponding amount and description:

"Provided that no person shall be entitled to exchange at any one time stock or securities of a nominal amount exceeding one thousand pounds, unless the stock or securities is or are the property of a friendly society entitled under Section thirty-nine of the Income Tax Act, 1918, to exemption from income tax."

(2) These Regulations may be cited as the Post Office Register Regulations, 1927.

The Civil Service Commissioners for Northern Ireland hereby give notice that the following Regulations are published with the approval of the Ministry of Finance for Northern Ireland, viz:—

REGULATIONS RESPECTING A LIMITED COMPETITIVE EXAMINATION FOR THE SITUATION OF JUNIOR MALE CLERK (MINISTRY OF LABOUR).

1. The examination will be held in Belfast on Saturday, the 20th August, 1927. To be eligible to compete thereat, a candidate must—

- at the date hereof be serving as a Temporary Clerk in a Department of the Government of Northern Ireland;
- have served in H.M. Forces in the War between the 4th August, 1914, and the 11th November, 1918; and
- have his candidature approved by the Head of the Department in which he is serving.

2. A candidate will be required to satisfy the Commissioners that he is duly qualified in respect of nationality, age, health, and character.

A candidate must be a British subject and must not be more than 50 years of age on the 31st October, 1927.

3. The competition will comprise the following:—

PART I.

Examination in the following subjects, all of which are obligatory:—

	Marks.
Arithmetic	30
Precis Writing (with Hand-writing, Spelling and Grammar)	70
General Knowledge	80
Intelligence	20

PART II.

Interview	100
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Of the candidates who obtain the highest aggregate marks in Part I, a number which will be determined in relation to the number of situations to be filled and taken in order of such aggregate marks, will be admitted to Part II, which will take place at a later date.

4. Subject to compliance with the provisions of paragraphs 1 and 2, candidates will be offered vacant appointments in the order in which they are finally placed in regard to their aggregate marks in Parts I and II of the examination. No candidate will be eligible for appointment who has not attained a reasonable standard of proficiency.

Orders for admission to the examination and information as to the exact time and place thereof will, in due course, be issued departmentally to approved candidates.

The Commissioners are authorised by the Ministry of Finance to furnish the following information regarding the appointments:—

The approved scale of salary is £80 rising by annual increments to £180, carrying Civil Service bonus at the ordinary rate. In placing successful candidates on the scale, allowances will be made in respect of service with H.M. Forces and previous temporary Civil Service up to a maximum of five years.

Increments are awarded annually on a certificate of good conduct and efficiency.

An appointee will be required to serve a probation normally lasting two years, and his appointment will not be confirmed unless such probation affords satisfactory proof of his fitness in all respects (including health) for final appointment. His services may be dispensed with at any time during the probationary period if the head of his department is satisfied that there is no reasonable prospect of his qualifying for confirmation.

Appointees may be required to serve in any part of Northern Ireland, and are liable to transfer at any time in the interests of the public service.

It is anticipated that the maximum number of vacancies to be filled from the examination will be 30.

MERCHANDISE MARKS.

The Merchandise Marks Exemption Direction (No. 3), 1927, dated August 3, 1927, made by the Board of Trade under Section 1 (3) of the Merchandise Marks Act, 1926 (16 and 17 Geo. 5, c. 63).

WHEREAS the Merchandise Marks Act, 1926 (16 and 17 Geo. 5, c. 53), Section 1, provides that it shall not be lawful to sell, expose for sale, or, by way of advertising goods of some other kind, distribute, in the United Kingdom, any imported goods to which there is applied any name or trade mark being, or purporting to be, the name or trade mark of any manufacturer, dealer or trader, or the name of any place or district in the United Kingdom, unless the name or trade mark is accompanied by an indication of origin:

And whereas Subsection (3) of the said Section 1 provides that if the Board of Trade are satisfied after considering such representations (if any) as may be made to them by any persons appearing to the Board of Trade to have a substantial interest in the matter, that, having regard to the special circumstances of the trade, difficulties would arise if the said Section 1 applied to goods of any class or description, or goods sold under any particular designation, and that public interests in the United Kingdom would not be materially prejudiced by exempting such goods from the operation of the said Section 1, they may direct that the said Section 1 shall not apply to such goods, or that goods shall not be treated as falling under the said Section 1 by reason only that they are so designated:

Now, therefore, the Board of Trade, having considered representations made to them in that behalf by persons appearing to the Board to have a substantial interest in the matter, and, after consultation with the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, the Secretary of State for the Home Department and the Secretary of State for Scotland, being satisfied that, having regard to the special circumstances of the trade, difficulties would arise if the said Section 1 applied to farm and garden seeds, and that public interests in the United Kingdom would not be materially prejudiced by exempting farm and garden seeds from the operation of the said Section 1, hereby direct in pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by the said Subsection (3) as follows:—

1. Section 1 of the Merchandise Marks Act, 1926, shall not apply to farm and garden seeds.

2. This Direction may be cited as the Merchandise Marks Exemption Direction (No. 3), 1927.
