SUPREME COURT OF JUDICATURE (IRELAND) ACT, 1877.

MERCHANDISE MARKS ACT, 1926.
REPORTS OF THE STANDING
COMMITTEE.

With reference to the notices which were published in certain issues of the London, Edinburgh and Belfast Gazettes regarding references made by the Board of Trade to the Standing Committee under the Merchandise Marks Act, 1926, namely:—

(a) in the issue of the said Gazettes of the 24th June in respect of imported mowing machines of the rotary blade type; and

(b) in the issue of the said Gazettes of the 8th July in respect of the following classes and descriptions of imported goods—

(1)a Gloves of leather or fur, whether finished or cut out ready for sewing;

b Fabric Gloves whether finished or cut out ready for sewing;

(2) Furniture and Cabinet ware made wholly or mainly of wood, including upholstered furniture and the frames thereof, the Board of Trade hereby give notice, in accordance with the provisions of Section 2.
