DISEASES OF ANIMALS ACTS (NORTHERN  
IRELAND) 1958 AND 1966

IMPORTATION OF HORSES, ASSES AND MULES  
(IRELAND) ORDER 1907

*General Licence*

The Department of Agriculture for Northern Ireland in accordance with the provisions of the above Order hereby licences the importation of horses from Great Britain, the Channel Islands and the Isle of Man subject to the following conditions:

1. the horses must be accompanied in transit by a certificate signed by a Local Veterinary Inspector of the Ministry of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food or of the Department of Agriculture and Fisheries for Scotland, within 6 hours of sailing time and within 9 miles of the port of embarkation, to the effect that the animals are fit to travel;
2. the animals must be embarked at such a time as to ensure their arrival in Northern Ireland during normal working hours;
3. the horses must travel in such a way as to comply with the requirements of the Horses (Sea Transport) Order (Northern Ireland) 1953, S.R. & O. No. 87. In the case of carriage of horses by roll-on roll-off transport any vehicle used must be of sound and substantial construction fitted with lashing points so positioned that the vehicle can be adequately secured to the deck of the vessel. There must be adequate ventilation for the number of animals carried, also adequate fixed internal lighting to enable all the animals to be properly tended. Access must be available to each and every animal

whether individually stalled or in pens (e.g. small horses, ponies or mares with foals at foot). The dimensions of each pen used for accommodation of the animals must be in accordance with current relevant legislation and, having regard to the size and number of animals and the construction of the divisions, cater adequately for the welfare of the animals.

This licence shall remain in operation until revoked by the Department of Agriculture.

DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH  
AND SOCIAL SERVICES

Notice is hereby given that the Department of Health and Social Services, in exercise of the powers conferred on it by sections 4, 7, 68 and 68A of the Food and Drugs Act (Northern Ireland) 1958, has made regulations entitled: Colouring Matter in Food (Amendment) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1976 (S.R. 1976, No. 382).

The regulations, which further amend the Colouring Matter in Food Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1973 (S.R. & O. (N.I.) 1973, No. 466), remove Fast Yellow AB E105, Orchil or Orcein E121, Solanthere Blue RS or Anthragen Blue or Indanthrene Blue E130, Black 7984 E152 and Burnt Umber E181 from the list of colouring matters permitted in or on food, and give effect to Council Directive No. 76/399/EEC.

The sale, consignment, delivery or advertisement for sale of these colouring matters will be prohibited from 17th January, 1977, and the sale, consignment, delivery, importation or advertisement for sale of food containing these colours will be prohibited from 1st January, 1978, so allowing almost one year for the clearance of existing stocks of food.

They also make a consequential amendment to the Cheese Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1970 (S.R. & O. (N.I.) 1970, No. 14) by deleting "orchil (orcein)" from the list of colours permitted in soft cheese.
