STATUTORY RULES OF NORTHERN IRELAND 1977 No. 44

Road Traffic and Vehicles¹

Restriction of Traffic (Routes D.R. 8a and 8d) Order (Northern Ireland) 1977

Made: 21st February, 1977.

Coming into operation: 4th April, 1977.

Whereas the Department of the Environment (in this Order referred to as "the Department") is satisfied that traffic should be prohibited on the lengths of road described in the Schedule by reason of works proposed to be executed;

And whereas the Department has had regard to the existence of alternative routes suitable for traffic which will be affected;

Now therefore the Department, in exercise of the power conferred by Section 22 of the Road Traffic Act (Northern Ireland) 1970 (a) and now vested in it (b) and of every other power enabling it in that behalf hereby orders as follows:

1. This Order may be cited as the Restriction of Traffic (Routes D.R. 8a and 8d) Order (Northern Ireland) 1977 and shall come into operation on 4th April, 1977.
2. (1) Subject to paragraph (2) the use of those lengths of Routes D.R. 8a and 8d described in the Schedule by any class or description of vehicles is prohibited for a period of four months from 3rd April, 1977.
(2) Paragraph (1) shall not apply to the use of the said lengths of road by vehicles requiring access to premises or lands within their lengths or to vehicles engaged in the works being executed.
