We, therefore, in pursuance of Section 1(3) of the Banking and Financial Dealings Act 1971, do hereby appoint Monday, the second day of January, and Monday, the first day of May in the year 1978 to be Bank Holidays in England, Wales and Northern Ireland, and Tuesday, the twenty-seventh day of December in the year 1977, and Monday, the twenty-ninth day of May in the year 1978, to be Bank Holidays in Scotland.

FOREST REPRODUCTIVE MATERIAL REGULATIONS (NORTHERN IRELAND) 1977

Notice is hereby given that the Department of Agriculture for Northern Ireland in exercise of the powers vested in it by section 1 (as amended by article 3 of and Schedule 3 to the European Communities (Agriculture) Order (Northern Ireland) 1972 and section 2(1), 2(2) and 2(3) of the Seeds Act (Northern Ireland) 1965, and all other powers enabling it in that behalf, made on 8th July, 1977 an order entitled the Forest Reproductive Material Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1977 (S.R. 1977 No. 194).

The Regulations shall come into operation on 1st September, 1977.

DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION

Notice is hereby given that the Department of Education in exercise of the powers conferred on it by Articles 57, 58 and 125 of the Education and Libraries (Northern Ireland) Order 1972 and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, has made a Statutory Rule entitled: The Teachers' Compulsory Absence and Maternity Leave (Amendment No. 2) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1977 (S.R. 1977 No. 215).

The purpose of this Rule is to revoke and replace the amending regulations (S.R. 1977 No. 83) and amend the principal regulations (S.R. 1976 No. 323) with regard to the rate of salary payable to those teachers who qualify for payment during maternity leave. The regulations provide that the salary so paid satisfies the requirements of the Industrial Relations (No. 2) (Northern Ireland) Order 1976.

They also provide that the rights of teachers who wish to avail themselves of the rights given to an employee in connection with maternity under the Industrial Relations (No. 2) (Northern Ireland) Order 1976 are not affected by the principal regulations.

The regulations have retrospective effect from 6th April, 1977.

DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE

Notice is hereby given that the Department of Commerce has made a statutory rule entitled Insurance Companies (Accounts and Forms) (Amendment) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1977 (S.R. 1977 No. 214) which come into operation on 3rd October, 1977.

The regulations amend the Insurance Companies (Accounts and Forms) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1969 to require insurance companies to reflect in accounts submitted thereunder, in respect of financial years ending on or after 31st December, 1977, the value of their assets. Their value is to be determined in accordance with the Insurance Companies (Valuation of Assets) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1977. The regulations also require the identification in accordance with the provisions of the Insurance Companies (Northern Ireland) Order 1976 [which was brought into operation on 19th April, 1976 (S.R. 1976 No. 56 (C.2)), of the assets and liabilities of companies attributable to long term business.

DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND SOCIAL SERVICES

Notice is hereby given that the Department of Health and Social Services in exercise of the powers conferred on it by sections 4, 7, 68 and 68A(b) of the Food and Drugs Act (Northern Ireland) 1958 has made the regulations entitled: Fruit Juices and Fruit Nectars Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1977 (S.R. 1977 No. 182).

These Regulations which implement Council Directive 75/726/EEC (OJ No. L311, 1.12.75, p.40) have been made to control the composition, description and labelling of fruit juices including concentrated and dried fruit juices and fruit nectars. The Regulations will come into force on 17th November, 1978 except for Regulations 1, 2 and 18 which come into force on 29th August, 1977.

The principal effects of these Regulations will be to:

- (a) define fruit juice, concentrated fruit juice, fruit nectar and dried fruit juice;
- (b) specify reserved descriptions for such products;

- (c) require those reserved descriptions and specified declarations to be applied in trade to these products when sold in containers, and prescribe the manner of marking or labelling to be applied;
- (d) specify permitted added ingredients.

DEPARTMENT OF THE ENVIRONMENT
