RULES OF THE SUPREME COURT (NORTHERN IRELAND).

WHEREAS by Section 61 of the Supreme Court of Judicature (Ireland) Act, 1877, as amended by Section 12 of the Supreme Court of Judicature (Ireland) (No. 2) Act, 1897, as those enactments apply to the Supreme Court of Judicature in Northern Ireland under and subject to the provisions of the Government of Ireland Act, 1920, the Irish Free State (Consequential Provisions) Act, 1922, the Supreme Court of Judicature (Northern Ireland) Order, 1921, and any other Order made by His Majesty in Council under either of the two last-mentioned Acts, it is provided that upon the recommendation and with the concurrence of a majority of all the Judges of the said Supreme Court of Judicature for the time being (of which the Lord Chief Justice of Northern Ireland shall be one), and one Barrister and one Solicitor (respectively practising in Northern Ireland) to be appointed for the purpose by the said Lord Chief Justice, by writing under his hand for such time as may be specified by him, the Governor of Northern Ireland may by Order in Council make Rules of Court and alter and annul any Rules of Court made under the enactments hereinbefore mentioned and for the time being in force in Northern Ireland:

And whereas certain Rules of Court, entitled "The Rules of the Supreme Court (Ireland), 1905," are in force in Northern Ireland under and subject to the provisions aforesaid, and as altered from time to time by the Lord Lieutenant and the said Governor by Orders in Council:

And whereas a majority of all the Judges of the said Supreme Court of Judicature and the

other persons upon whose recommendation the said Governor may make, alter or annul Rules of Court as respects Northern Ireland, present on the 25th day of October, 1927, at a meeting for that purpose held (of which majority the Lord Chief Justice of Northern Ireland was one) have passed the resolution set out in the Schedule hereto for the making of certain Rules of Court in the manner appearing in the said Schedule:

And whereas the provisions of Section 1 of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, have been complied with:

Now I, James Albert Edward, Duke of Abercorn, Governor of Northern Ireland, by and with the advice of the Privy Council of Northern Ireland, in pursuance and by virtue of the Supreme Court of Judicature (Ireland) Act, 1877, as amended and applied to the said Supreme Court of Judicature as hereinbefore mentioned, and of all other powers enabling me in this behalf, and with the concurrence of a majority of all the Judges and the other persons hereinbefore mentioned and present at the meeting aforesaid, do hereby make the Rules of Court set out in the Schedule hereto, as additions to the Rules of Orders LIV. D and LV. of the Rules of the Supreme Court (Ireland) 1905;

And I do hereby order that the Rules made by this Order in Council shall take effect on and from the date hereof.

SCHEDULE.

We, being a majority of the Judges of the Supreme Court of Judicature of Northern Ireland, and the other persons, pursuant to the twelfth Section of the Supreme Court of Judicature (Ireland) (No. 2) Act, 1897 (as adapted by Order in Council dated 21st day of November, 1921, made under the provisions of the Government of Ireland Act, 1920, which said latter Act was subsequently modified by the Irish Free State (Consequential Provisions) Act, 1922), upon whose recommendation the Governor of Northern Ireland may make, alter or annul Rules of Court, under the sixty-first Section of the Supreme Court of Judicature (Ireland) Act, 1877, present at a meeting for that purpose held (of which majority the Lord Chief Justice of Northern Ireland is one) do, pursuant to the powers conferred on us by the Government of Ireland Act, 1920, and adaptation of the Judicature (Ireland) Acts, 1877 to 1897, made by said Order in Council, and of all other powers us thereunto enabling, hereby express our concurrence in an Order being made by the Governor of Northern Ireland in Council, making as Statutory Rules under the Rules Publication Act, 1893, the Rules of Court hereinafter expressed and set forth

ORDER LIV. D.

(a) Add at the end of the heading to Order LIV. D) as an additional part of the heading the following words:—

III. THE INDUSTRIAL ASSURANCE ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1924.

(b) Add at the end of Order LIV. D as an additional part of that Order the following Rules:—

III. INDUSTRIAL ASSURANCE ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1924

40. Every appeal to the High Court under Section 7 (2) of the Act from a refusal of the Ministry or under Sections 17 (3), 18 (1) (f), 30 (1) or 45 (2) of the Act from a refusal, direction, decision or award of the Commissioner, shall be instituted in the Chancery Division by originating notice of motion, and shall be heard and determined by a Judge of the High Court. The determination of the appeal by such Judge shall be final unless leave to appeal is given by him or by the Court of Appeal.

41. The notice of motion shall be in the Form No. 5 set out in the Appendix hereto and shall state the grounds of appeal. No grounds other than those so stated shall (except with the leave of the Court and on such terms as the Court may think just) be allowed to be taken by the appellant at the hearing of the appeal. The date mentioned in the notice for the hearing of the appeal shall be not less than fourteen days after the service of the motion.

42. Every appeal shall be brought within twenty-one days of the refusal of the Ministry or the direction, decision or award of the Commissioner or within such extended time as the Court may think fit to allow.

43. The notice of motion shall be served on the Ministry and the Commissioner, but the Court may at any stage of the proceedings direct the notice of motion to be served on any other person or persons and may, if it shall appear expedient so to do, cause notice to be given by advertisement or otherwise of the nature of the appeal and of the time when it will be or is likely to be heard and disposed of or otherwise make provision for enabling any person interested in the collecting society or industrial assurance company concerned or in the subject matter of the appeal to appear and be heard on the appeal.

44. The ordinary practice and rules in the Chancery Division shall in so far as the same are not inconsistent with this Part of this Order apply to proceedings under this Part of this Order.

45. Any interlocutory orders or directions (not involving the decision of the appeal) which may be

authorised by this Part of this Order or which may be necessary or desirable in the course of the proceedings may be made or given by a Judge of the High Court, and shall be applied for by summons (intituled in the same manner as the notice of motion) returnable at the Chambers of the Chancery Judge.

46. On every appeal the Court shall have all the powers vested by the Act in the Ministry or the Commissioner and may make any order which ought to or might have been made by the Ministry or the Commissioner.

47. On every appeal under Section 7 (2) or Section 17 (3) of the Act the appellant shall before the service of the notice of motion apply *ex parte* to the Court for leave to appeal. Such application shall be supported by an affidavit setting out the material facts, the effect of the refusal of the Ministry or the direction of the Commissioner and the grounds upon which the application is made and stating that the deponent is advised and believes that the appellant has good grounds for appealing. No order giving leave to appeal shall be drawn up, but the Registrar shall endorse upon the face of the notice of motion and sign a note stating that such leave has been granted by the Court, and the date when such leave was granted, and a copy of such note shall appear upon every copy of the notice of motion to be served upon any respondent to the motion.

48. The costs of every appeal and of any proceedings connected therewith and of any proceedings before the Commissioner shall be in the discretion of the Court.

49. In this Part of this Order "the Act" means "The Industrial Assurance Act (Northern Ireland), 1924;" "the Commissioner" means "the Industrial Assurance Commissioner for Northern Ireland" constituted by Section 2 of the Act; and "the Ministry" means "the Ministry of Commerce for Northern Ireland."

NOTICE of Application for a Special Order under Section 26 of the Electricity (Supply) Act, 1929.

The Urban District Council of Holywood, whose address is the Town Hall, Holywood, Co. Down (hereinafter called the Undertakers), hereby give Notice that they intend making application to the Electricity Commissioners for Northern Ireland for a Special Order for the following purposes:—

1. To authorise the Undertakers to sell electricity for all public and private purposes as defined by the Electricity (Supply) Acts, 1882 to 1919 within the Urban District of Holywood as constituted at the commencement of this Order and those parts of the Rural District of Castlereagh which are (a) to the north eastward of the Urban District of Holywood and contained between high water mark on the south shore of Belfast Lough and a line drawn due south from the landing stage at Rockport for one mile and thence in a south westerly direction to the extreme east point of the Holywood Urban District Boundary in Church Road; and (b) to the south westward of the Urban District of Holywood and contained between a line drawn from the junction of the south and east boundaries of the said Urban District to the road known as "Jackson's Road," thence along this road to the old Holywood Road and thence along the old Holywood Road to the Belfast County Borough Boundary, and bounded on the south by the Belfast County Borough Boundary and on the north west by Belfast Lough.

2. To authorise the Undertakers to break up the streets and parts of streets and railways shown in the First part of the Schedule hereto.

3. To prescribe the maximum price which may be charged for electricity.

4. The streets and parts of streets in which it is proposed that electric mains shall be laid down for the purposes of General Supply within a specified time are those named in the second part of the Schedule hereto.

The maximum price proposed to be charged is one shilling per unit.

Notice is hereby given that every local or other Public Authority, Company or Persons desirous of bringing before the Electricity Com-
