# DEPARTMENT OF THE ENVIRONMENT

### **ROADS ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND) 1948**

The Department of the Environment hereby gives notice of its intention to make an Order under Section 17 of the Roads Act (Northern Ireland) 1948, the effect of which would be to authorise the stopping-up to vehicular traffic of a length of approximately 97 metres of Route DR101 in the townland of Kilmore, County Down, between its junctions with Route B12 and Route C362.

The length of road proposed to be stopped-up is delineated on a map which, together with a copy of the draft Order, may be inspected free of charge at all reasonable hours during the period from 19th April 1978 to 29th May 1978 at the offices of the Department of the Environment, Roads Service, Headquarters Division, Room 42, Stoney Road, Belfast BT4 3TR; the Department's Divisional Roads Service, Craigavon House, Bachelor's Walk, Portadown; or in the Carnegie Library, Carnegie Street, Lurgan.

The Department of the Environment hereby gives notice of its intention to make an Order under Section 17 of the Roads Act (Northern Ireland) 1948, the effect of which would be to abandon a length of approximately 20 metres of Olympia Street, Belfast, extending in a south-westerly direction from a point approximately 20 metres south-west of its junction with Olympia Drive.

## ROAD TRAFFIC ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND) 1970

The Department of the Environment has made a Statutory Rule under Sections 61 and 189 of the Road Traffic Act (Northern Ireland) 1970 entitled the Public Service Vehicles (Amendment) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1978 (S.R. 1978 No. 80).

These Regulations, which came into operation on 3rd April 1978, take account of the introduction of prepurchased multi-journey tickets to replace the token system of paying for bus journeys.

#### **ROADS (NORTHERN IRELAND) ORDER 1975**

## STATUTORY RULES OF NORTHERN IRELAND 1978 No. 82

#### ROAD TRAFFIC AND VEHICLES

Restriction of Traffic (Routes C416, DR559, DR542 and DR615) Order (Northern Ireland) 1978

Made: 23rd March 1978 Coming into operation: 29th April 1978

Whereas the Department of the Environment (in this Order referred to as "the Department") is satisfied that traffic should be prohibited on the lengths of road described in the Schedule by reason of works proposed to be executed;

And whereas the Department has had regard to the existence of alternative routes suitable for traffic which will be affected;

Now therefore the Department, in exercise of the power conferred by Section 22 of the Road Traffic Act (Northern Ireland) 1970 (a) and now vested in it (b), and of every other power enabling it in that behalf, hereby orders as follows:

- This Order may be cited as the Restriction of Traffic (Routes C416, DR559, DR542 and DR615) Order (Northern Ireland) 1978 and shall come into operation on 29th April 1978.
- (1) Subject to paragraph (2), the use of those lengths of road described in the Schedule by any class or description of vehicles is prohibited for a period of five months from 28th April 1978.
  - (2) Paragraph (1) shall not apply to the use of the said lengths of road by vehicles requiring access to premises or lands within their length or to vehicles engaged in the works being executed.

#### SCHEDULE

### Lengths of road referred to

- A length of approximately 10 yards of Route C416 in the townland of Cavanacross in the District and County of Fermanagh, between its junctions with Route DR615, more particularly delineated and coloured red on Map No. 4023/106/7.
- (2) A length of approximately 1310 yards of Route DR559 in the townlands of Thomastown, Rossyvullen and Bonnybrook in the District and County of Fermanagh, extending in a generally north-easterly direction from a point approximately 830 yards north-west of its junction with Route DR569, more particularly delineated and coloured green on Map No. 4023/106/7.
- (3) A length of approximately 130 yards of Route DR542 in the townland of Ballylucas in the District and County of Fermanagh, extending from its junction with Routes DR615 and DR591, more particularly delineated and coloured yellow on Map No. 4023/ 106/7.
- (4) Two lengths totalling approximately 3140 yards of Route DR615 in the townlands of Ballylucas, Cloghtate and Cavanacross in the District and County of Fermanagh, extending from its junction with Routes DR591 and DR542, more particularly delineated and coloured blue on Map No. 4023/106/7.
