- The following diseases were eradicated from Northern Ireland in the years indicated: Cattle plague or rinderpest (pestis bovina) 1877; foot-and-mouth disease (fièvre aphteuse) 1941; glanders (including farcy) (malleus) 1913; parasitic mange (sarcoptes scabiei equi) 1946; pleuro-pneumonia (pleuro-pneumonia contagiosa bovum) 1893; rabies (rage) 1923; sheep pox (variola ovina) 1850; and swine fever (peste porcine) 1958.
- The following diseases have never been recorded in Northern Ireland: Swine vesicular disease, African horse sickness, (pestis equorum), African swine fever (pestis suum africana), blue tongue (febris catarrhalis ovium), dourine (exanthema coitale paralyticum), equine encephalomyelitis (meningo-encephalomyelitis enzootica eq), equine infectious anaemia (anaemia infectiosa equorum), lumpy skin disease (dermatosis nodularis), Teschen disease (encephalomyelitis enzootica suum), epizootic lymphangitis (lymphangitis epizootica) and fowl plague (pestis avium).

NOTICES UNDER THE BANKRUPTCY ACTS

IN THE HIGH COURT OF JUSTICE

In Bankruptcy

APPLICATION OF THE BANKRUPT

Take notice that a meeting of creditors will be held before the Court at the Royal Courts of Justice (Ulster), Chichester Street, Belfast, on the 16th day of May 1978, at 11.30 a.m., to consider the following offer of composition by the bankrupt:

(a) To pay to the Official Assignee as trustee for the creditors all prescribed Court fees and the Official Assignee's expenses and all claims which are preferential under the law of bankruptcy and to pay a dividend of 10p in the £ to all unsecured and partly secured creditors by one payment in cash within two months from the date of approval of this proposal by the Court or such further time as the Court may allow.

(b) In consideration of the proposal set forth in paragraph (a) hereof being accepted by the creditors of Michael James Stephens and the Court, Samuel Agnew Stephens, father of the bankrupt, shall pay to the Official Assignee

such sum as is required to carry out the proposal set forth in paragraph (a) hereof, such sum to be held by the Official Assignee upon the trusts set forth in paragraph (a) hereof.

If three-fifths in value of all creditors present at this meeting in person or by proxy and three-fifths in number of those creditors who have proved debts of at least £20 so present agree to accept such offer of composition, or any modification thereof made with leave of the Court, the Court, unless it shall be shown that the offer is not reasonable and proper to be executed under the control of the Court, may thereafter annul the adjudication of bankruptcy, and every creditor shall be bound to accept such composition.
