A PROCLAMATION

FOR APPOINTING THURSDAY, JULY 12th, 1928, A BANK HOLIDAY AND A PUBLIC HOLIDAY IN NORTHERN IRELAND.

ABERCORN.

I, James Albert Edward, Duke of Abercorn, Governor of Northern Ireland, by and with the advice of the Privy Council of Northern Ireland in pursuance of the Bank Holidays Act, 1871, the Holidays Extension Act, 1875, and the Irish Free State (Consequential Provisions) Act, 1922, and of every power me thereunto enabling, do hereby appoint Thursday, the Twelfth day of July next, as a special day to be observed as a Bank Holiday and as a Public Holiday in Northern Ireland, under and in accordance with the said Acts, and I do by this Proclamation command the said day to be so observed, and all loving subjects of His Majesty to order themselves accordingly.

Given at the Council Chamber, Stormont Castle, Belfast, this 30th day of April, in the Year of Our Lord, One Thousand Nine Hundred and Twenty-eight.
