### NORTHERN IRELAND OFFICE

Notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State in pursuance of section 36(1)(a) of the Coroners Act (Northern Ireland) 1959 read with section 18 of the Administrative and Financial Provisions Act (Northern Ireland) 1962 after consultation with the Minister for the Civil Service, has made a Statutory Rule entitled the Coroners (Salaries) (Amendment) Rules (Northern Ireland) 1979. These rules amend the Coroners (Salaries) Rules (Northern Ireland) 1975 by increasing the salary of the coroner's officer for the City of Belfast with effect from 2nd September, 1977, and by awarding him an annual allowance from 2nd September, 1977, for acting as coroner's officer for the coroner's district of North Down.

#### European Pharmacopoeia

#### Amendment to Volume II of the European Pharmacopoeia

On behalf of the Health Ministers, that is to say the Secretaries of State respectively concerned with health in England, in Wales and in Scotland and on behalf of the Department of Health and Social Services for Northern Ireland, it is hereby declared under Section 65 (8) of the Medicines Act 1968 that on and after 1st January, 1979, the Amendment to Volume II of the European Pharmacopoeia, namely a revised text of the Test of Sterility, adopted as Resolution AP-CSP (78) 1 by the Public Health Committee (Partial Agreement) of the Council of Europe, on 20th October, 1978, and published in accordance with the Convention on the Elaboration of a European Pharmacopoeia, is to have effect for the purposes of the said Section 65.

#### REDEMPTION AND CONVERSION OF 8½% ULSTER DEVELOPMENT BONDS

The effect of the Order is, subject to certain specified exemptions, to limit the sulphur content of gas oil used in any furnace or engine (other than one in a power station, ship or diesel engine motor vehicle) to not more than 0.8 per cent by weight between 5th March 1979 and 30th September, 1980, and to not more than 0.5 per cent by weight from 1st October, 1980, onwards.
