#### NOTICE BY THE BANK OF ENGLAND

CALLING IN CERTAIN BANK NOTES OF THE £1 AND £10 DENOMINATIONS

The Bank of England, in exercise of the powers conferred upon them by Section 1 (5) of the Currency and Bank Notes Act 1954, hereby call in on 31st May, 1979, for payment of the face value thereof, all the notes of the Bank of England of the denomination of £1 which formed part of the series first in issue at the Bank on 17th March, 1960, and all the notes of the Bank of England of the denomination of £10 which formed part of the series first in issue at the Bank on 21st February, 1964. By virtue of the said Section 1 (5) the notes hereby called in will cease to be legal tender after 31st May, 1979.
