EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Order but is intended to indicate its general purport)

This Order revokes the Restriction of Traffic (Unclassified Road No. 1734, Mullaghslin Glebe) Order (Northern Ireland) 1978 which prohibited the use by vehicular traffic of a 91 metre section of unclassified road No. 1734 in the townland of Mullaghslin Glebe, Omagh, Co. Tyrone; during the construction of a bridge over Coolaghty Burn.

The Order is no longer necessary as the road works on this section of road are not now required.

The following diseases have never been recorded in Northern Ireland: Swine vesicular disease, African horse sickness (pestis equorum), African swine fever (pestis suum africana), blue tongue (febris catarrhalis ovium), dourine (exanthema coitale paralyticum), equine encephalomyelitis (meningo-encephalomyelitis enzootica eq), equine infectious anaemia (anaemia infectiosa equorum), lumpy skin disease (dermatosis nodularis), Teschen disease (encephalomyelitis enzootica suum), epizootic lymphangitis (lymphangitis epizootica) and fowl plague (pestis avium).
