GOVERNMENT OF NORTHERN IRELAND.

MINISTRY OF AGRICULTURE. THE FERTILISERS AND FEEDING STUFFS ACT, 1926.

NOTICE is hereby given that in pursuance of the powers conferred by the above-mentioned Act, and by every other power enabling it in that behalf, the Ministry of Agriculture has, on the 5th day of June, 1928, made

- (a) an Order entitled "The Fertilisers and Feeding Stuffs (Northern Ireland) Order, 1928," appointing the 1st day of July, 1928, as the day on which the above-mentioned Act shall come into operation in Northern Ireland; and
- (b) Regulations entitled "The Fertilisers and Feeding Stuffs (Northern Ireland) Regulations, 1928."

LOCAL REGISTRATION OF TITLE (IRELAND) ACT, 1891.

WHEREAS by Order, dated 31st day of July, 1923, The Right Honourable Sir Denis Stanislaus Henry, Baronet, then Lord Chief Justice of Northern Ireland, pursuant to the powers conferred on him by the Government of Ireland Act, 1920, and the adaptation of the Judicature (Ireland) Acts, 1877 to 1897, made by Order in Council, dated 31st October, 1921, and of all other powers him thereunto enabling, with the concurrence of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury as regards the number of the Staff to be appointed and the salaries to be paid to each, did determine that the Officers specified in the Schedule to said Order of 31st July, 1923, were requisite for the organisation of the Central Office for Northern Ireland under the Local Registration of Title (Ireland), Act, 1891, and did constitute said Offices:

And Whereas it is provided in the said Schedule that vacancies in the position of Chief Clerk shall be filled by appointment by the Lord
