ACQUISITION OF LAND (ASSESSMENT OF COMPENSATION) ACT, 1919.

NOTICE is hereby given that, in pursuance of sub-section (6) of Section 3 of the Acquisition of Land (Assessment of Compensation) Act, 1919, the Ministry of Finance for Northern Ireland has made rules governing the amount of fees which shall be charged for proceedings under the Act in respect of land authorised to be acquired by any local authority or any public authority as defined for the purposes of the Act.

FACTORY AND WORKSHOP.

WELFARE.

NOTICE is hereby given that on the 4th July, 1928, the Ministry of Labour for Northern Ireland in pursuance of the powers conferred on it by Section 7 of the Police, Factories, etc. (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act, 1916, and the Government of Ireland Act, 1920, and the several Orders made thereunder, made an Order for securing the welfare of the workers employed in factories and workshops, or parts thereof, in which is carried on the cleaning or repairing of sacks.

The Order, which may be cited as the Sacks (Cleaning and Repairing) Welfare Order (Northern Ireland), 1928 will come into force on the 1st September, 1928.
