MERCHANDISE MARKS ACT, 1926.

In accordance with the provisions of Section 2, sub-Section (4) of the Merchandise Marks Act, 1926, the Board of Trade give notice that in pursuance of an application received by them for the making of an Order-in-Council to require imported tea to bear an indication of origin, they have made a reference to the Standing Committee appointed by them under the Act in respect thereof.

Attention is called to the fact that, while, under the provisions of the above Act, the Committee must in every case referred to them consider whether the goods should bear an indication of origin at the time of sale or exposure for sale, they may also at their discretion consider and report upon the question whether such goods should bear an indication of origin at the time of importation.

MERCHANDISE MARKS ACT, 1926. DECLARATION BY THE BOARD OF TRADE.

TEA.

WHEREAS by Sub-section (1) of Section 10 of the Merchandise Marks Act, 1926 (16-17 Geo. V. c. 53), it is provided that for the purposes of the said Act unless the context otherwise requires the expression "agricultural and horticultural produce and the produce of any fishing industry" includes all foodstuffs other than such foodstuffs as the Board of Trade (hereinafter called "the Board") with the concurrence of the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries may declare not to be foodstuffs for stuff for the purposes of the aforesaid definition.

And whereas the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries has concurred in a proposal of the Board to declare tea not to be a foodstuff for the purposes of the said definition:

Now, therefore, the Board with the concurrence of the Minister of Agriculture and

Fisheries hereby declare tea not to be a foodstuff for the purposes of the aforesaid definition.
