### OFFICE OF FAIR TRADING

#### MONOPOLY REFERENCE: CONCRETE ROOFING TILES

The Director General of Fair Trading in exercise of his powers under sections 47(1), 49(1) and 50(1) of the Fair Trading Act 1973 hereby refers to the Monopolies and Mergers Commission the matter of the existence or possible existence of a monopoly situation in relation to the supply in the United Kingdom of concrete roofing tiles.

The Commission shall upon this reference investigate and report in relation to such supply on the questions whether a monopoly situation exists and, if so:

- by virtue of which provisions of section 6 of that Act that monopoly situation is to be taken to exist;
- in favour of what person or persons that monopoly situation exists;
- whether any steps (by way of uncompetitive practices or otherwise) are being taken by that person or those persons for the purpose of exploiting or maintaining the monopoly situation and, if so, by what uncompetitive practices or in what other way;
- whether any action or omission on the part of that person or those persons is attributable to the existence of the monopoly situation and, if so, what action or omission and in what way it is so attributable; and
- whether any facts found by the Commission in pursuance of their investigations under the preceding provisions of this paragraph operate, or may be expected to operate, against the public interest.

The Commission shall report on this reference within a period of eighteen months from the date hereof.

BUILDING REGULATIONS (NORTHERN IRELAND)  
ORDERS 1972 AND 1978

Notice is hereby given that the Department of Finance in exercise of the powers conferred on it by Article 1(2) of the Building Regulations (Northern Ireland) Order 1978 has made a statutory rule entitled Building Regulations (1978 Order) (Commencement No. 1) Order (Northern Ireland) 1979. This Order brings into operation certain provisions of the Building Regulations (Northern Ireland) Order 1978.

## LOUGH ERNE NAVIGATION

*Lough Erne (Navigation) (Amendment) Bye-laws  
(Northern Ireland) 1979*

(S.R. 1979 No. 332)

Made ..... 17th September, 1979

Coming into operation ..... 1st November, 1979

The Department of Agriculture(a) in exercise of the powers conferred on it by Article 41 and Schedule 7 of the Drainage (Northern Ireland) Order 1973(b) hereby makes the following Bye-laws:

*Citation and commencement*

1. These Bye-laws may be cited as the Lough Erne (Navigation) (Amendment) Bye-laws (Northern Ireland) 1979 and shall come into operation on 1st November, 1979.

*Amendment*

2. The Lough Erne (Navigation) Bye-laws (Northern Ireland) 1978 shall be amended as follows:

For Bye-law 25(1) (which relates to speed limits and behaviour on the navigation) there shall be substituted the following:

"(1) the stretch of waterway from a point 200 metres upstream of Carrybridge to a point 550 metres downstream of Carrybridge".

These Bye-laws come into operation on 1st November, 1979, extend the area of waterway restricted by speed limit at Carrybridge.

## DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE

## UNSOLICITED GOODS AND SERVICES

The Department of Commerce has made Regulations entitled "Unsolicited Goods and Services (Invoices Etc.) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1979." (S.R. 1979 No. 323.) These regulations, which come into operation on 15th October, 1979, and revoke the Unsolicited Goods and Services (Invoices etc.) Regulations (NI) 1976 No. 239 set out the requirements with which invoices and similar documents must comply if they are not to be regarded as asserting a right to payment for the purposes of the Unsolicited Goods and Services (Northern Ireland) Order 1976 (SI 1976/57 (NI 1)). The Regulations specify the colour of the paper and of the lettering of any such documents. They require two notices to be printed on each page in which the amount of any payment is stated and they specify the form and position of the notices and other requirements relating to them.

The Regulations also specify the contents required in a note of a person's agreement to a charge for an entry in a directory. They require:

- i. the charge for the entry to be clearly stated above the place for the signature of the person ordering the entry;
- ii. the particulars of the entry for which the charge is made to be set out on the note;
- iii. certain details of the directory to be given including identification of the directory, publication date, method of circulation and number of copies to be produced.

Notice is hereby given that the Department of the Environment for Northern Ireland in exercise of the powers conferred on it by Section 19 of the Road Traffic Act (Northern Ireland) 1970 and of all other enabling powers made on 12th September, 1979, an Order entitled One-Way Traffic (Millisle) Order (Northern Ireland) 1979 (S.R. 1979 No. 316) which will come into operation on 1st November, 1979.

This Order gives legal effect to a one-way traffic system in the town of Millisle.

The Department of the Environment has made a Statutory Rule under sections 55, 61 and 189 of the Road Traffic Act (Northern Ireland) 1970 entitled the Public Service Vehicles (Amendment) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1979. (S.R. 1979 No. 317.)

These Regulations which come into operation on 1st November, 1979, increase the fees payable for licences for all public service vehicles.

Copies of the Regulations may be purchased from HMSO, Chichester House, Chichester Street, Belfast.

The Department of the Environment has made a Statutory Rule under sections 8 and 189 of the Road Traffic Act (Northern Ireland) 1970 entitled the Motor Vehicles (Driving Licences) (Amendment) (No. 2) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1979. (S.R. 1979 No. 318.)

These Regulations which come into operation on 1st November, 1979, increase the fee for a driving test on all types of vehicles except invalid carriages (for which no fee is payable).

The Department of the Environment has made a Statutory Rule under sections 71 and 189 of the Road Traffic Act (Northern Ireland) 1970 entitled the Heavy Goods Vehicles (Drivers' Licences) (Amendment) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1979. (S.R. 1979 No. 319.)

These Regulations which come into operation on 1st November, 1979, increase the fee payable for a heavy goods vehicle driving test.

Copies of the Regulations may be purchased from HMSO, Chichester House, Chichester Street, Belfast.

The Department of the Environment has made a Statutory Rule under sections 117, 117C and 189 of the Road Traffic Act (Northern Ireland) 1970 entitled the Motor Cars (Driving Instruction) (Amendment) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1979. (S.R. 1979 No. 320.)

These Regulations which come into operation on 1st November, 1979, increase the fees payable for the examination, licensing and registration of approved driving instructors. A new fee for the first 4 year period of registration has also been introduced.

The Department of the Environment has made a Statutory Rule under sections 29A, 29C, 29D and 189 of the Road Traffic Act (Northern Ireland) 1970 entitled the Motor Vehicle Testing (Amendment) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1979. (S.R. 1979 No. 321.)

These Regulations which come into operation on 1st November, 1979, increase the fees payable for vehicle test certificates (including duplicates for motor cars and motor bicycles).

Notice is hereby given that the Department of the Environment for Northern Ireland in exercise of the powers conferred by Section 183(1) of the Road Traffic Act (Northern Ireland) 1970 and of all other enabling powers made on 12th September, 1979, Regulations entitled Road Traffic (Crown Exemption) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1979 (S.R. 1979 No. 322) which will come into operation on 1st November, 1979.

These Regulations exempt from speed limits any vehicle being used by or on behalf of the Department of the Environment to measure skid resistance of roads. They also exempt any person driving such a vehicle.

2. Lough Road in the Town and County of Antrim at a point approximately 125 metres west of its junction with Dublin Road.
3. Dublin Road in the Town and County of Antrim at a point approximately 186 metres south of its junction with Lough Road.

##### *Restriction of Traffic (Poleglass Lane) Order (Northern Ireland) 1979*

(S.R. 1979 No. 329)

Made ..... 20th September, 1979

Coming into operation ..... 23rd October, 1979

The Department of the Environment being satisfied that traffic on the length of road described in article 2 should by reason of works being executed be restricted or prohibited and having regard to the existence of alternative routes suitable for the traffic which will be affected and in exercise of the powers conferred by section 22 of the Road Traffic Act (Northern Ireland) 1970(a) and now vested in it(b) and of every other power enabling it in that behalf hereby makes the following order:

##### *Citation and commencement*

1. This order may be cited as the Restriction of Traffic (Poleglass Lane) Order (Northern Ireland) 1979 and shall come into operation on 23rd October, 1979.

##### *Prohibition*

2. Subject to article 3 the use of that length of approximately 350 metres of Poleglass Lane in the townland of Poleglass, District of Lisburn and County of Antrim, extending in a south-easterly direction from its junction with Old Collin Road (Route DR 17) by vehicles is prohibited for a period of 9 months commencing on 23rd October, 1979.

##### *Exemptions*

3. Article 2 shall not apply to vehicles:
  - (a) engaged in the works being executed; or
  - (b) requiring access to land abutting on said length of road.

Any person who acts in contravention of the order shall be guilty of an offence and is liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding £50.

The Department of the Environment being satisfied that traffic on the length of road described in article 2 should by reason of works being executed be restricted or prohibited and having regard to the existence of alternative routes suitable for the traffic which will be affected and in exercise of the powers conferred by section 22 of the Road Traffic Act (Northern Ireland) 1970(a) and now vested in it (b) and of every other power enabling it in that behalf hereby makes the following order:

*Citation and commencement*

1. This order may be cited as the Restriction of Traffic (Carrickmore Road, Ballycastle) Order (Northern Ireland) 1979 and shall come into operation on 1st November, 1979.

*Prohibition*

2. Subject to article 3 the use of that length of approximately 1650 metres of Carrickmore Road, Ballycastle, extending in a north-easterly direction from a point 550 metres north-east of its junction with the Cushendall Road by vehicles is prohibited for a period of 4 months commencing on 1st November, 1979.

*Exemptions*

- 3 Article 2 shall not apply to vehicles:
  - (a) engaged in the works being executed; or
  - (b) requiring access to land abutting on said length of road.
