CEREMONIAL OBSERVED AT THE RE-CEPTION AND THE SWEARING IN OF HIS GRACE, JAMES EDWARD ALBERT, DUKE OF ABERCORN, KNIGHT OF THE MOST NOBLE ORDER OF THE GARTER, KNIGHT OF THE MOST ILLUSTRIOUS ORDER OF ST. PATRICK, AS GOVERNOR OF NORTHERN IRELAND — 17th DECEMBER, 1928.

His Grace the Duke of Abercorn was received on his arrival at the Courts of Justice, Belfast, by the Lord Chief Justice and the Judges of the Supreme Court of Judicature of Northern Ireland and conducted to the Appeal Court where His Grace's Warrant of Appointment as Governor of Northern Ireland was presented to the Lord Chief Justice of Northern Ireland.

After the Royal Warrant of Apointment had been read by the Prime Minister of Northern Ireland, the Oath of Allegiance and the Official Oath were administered to His Grace by the Lord Chief Justice of Northern Ireland.

His Grace took the Oath of Allegiance and the Official Oath, and proceeded with the Prime Minister, the Members of the Cabinet of Northern Ireland and the Clerk of the Privy Council to hold a meeting of the Privy Council of Northern Ireland.
