### WAGES COUNCILS ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND) 1945

#### *Road Haulage Wages Council (Northern Ireland)*

The Road Haulage Wages Council (Northern Ireland) hereby gives notice of its intention to submit to the Department of Manpower Services proposals for fixing statutory minimum remuneration in substitution for the statutory minimum remuneration fixed by the current wages regulation orders relating to workers in respect of whom the Wages Council operates.

The Wages Council will consider any written representations with respect to the above-mentioned proposals which may be sent to it within twenty-one days from 22nd May 1981.
