NOTICE of intention to make a Special Order amending the Mercantile Marine Special Order, 1921.

The Ministry of Labour for Northern Ireland hereby gives notice that it intends, pursuant to the powers conferred on it by Sections 37 and 39 of the Unemployment Insurance Act, 1920, to make a Special Order amending the Unemployment Insurance (Mercantile Marine) Special Order, 1921, with reference to the exclusion from the Unemployment Insurance Acts of masters, seamen, or apprentices who are neither domiciled nor have a place of residence in the United Kingdom, and the liability of the Employer to pay contributions in respect of such persons.

Copies of the Draft Special Order may be obtained, on application in writing to the Ministry of Labour for Northern Ireland, Ormeau Avenue, Belfast.

Objections to the Draft Special Order must be sent to the above address within 21 days from the 18th January, 1929.

Every Objection must be in writing and must state—

- (a) the Draft Order or portions of the Draft Order objected to;
- (b) the specific grounds for objection; and
- (c) omissions, additions or modifications asked for.
