### NORTHERN IRELAND OFFICE

#### BUILDING REGULATIONS (NORTHERN IRELAND) ORDER 1979

Notice is hereby given that the Department of Finance in exercise of the powers conferred on it by Articles 3 and 5(1) of the Building Regulations (Northern Ireland) Order 1979 has made a statutory rule entitled-Building (Amendment) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1982 (SR 1982 No. 81).

These Regulations, which come into operation on 1st July 1982, introduce further amendments to the Building Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1977.

The main change is the introduction of a new Part E (Structural Fire Precautions) which is a revision of Part E (Structural Fire Precautions) of the existing regulations.

The principal amendments in the new Part E:

- (a) introduce specific requirements for assembly buildings and buildings within the same boundary;
- (b) introduce further requirements to control pipes passing through a "cavity barrier" and the movement of smoke;
- (c) extend the control of wall surfaces to include the surface of glass as well as other light transmitting material;
- (d) introduce requirements for the fire resisting structure enclosing the stairway in a house having 3 or more storeys;
- (e) introduce provisions to cater for the permitted use of certain specific plastics materials in particular situations; and
- (f) introduce less onerous requirements for rooflights.

### THE BELFAST (No. 19) SMOKE CONTROL ORDER (NORTHERN IRELAND) 1982
