NOTICE OF SUBMISSION OF DRAFT REGULATIONS ENTITLED THE CHILD BENEFIT (GENERAL) AMENDMENT REGULATIONS 1982

The Social Security Advisory Committee give notice that they have been asked by the Secretary of State for Social Services under Section 10 of the Social Security Act 1980 to consider and report on regulations entitled The Child Benefit (General) Amendment Regulations 1982.

These Regulations will apply to Great Britain only. Corresponding provision for Northern Ireland will be made in regulations made by the Department of Health and Social Services for Northern Ireland. The Northern Ireland Regulations will not require prior submission to the Social Security Advisory Committee by virtue of paragraph 21 of Schedule 3 to the Social Security Act 1980 (1080 C.30).

A short explanatory note provided by the Department of Health and Social Security on these regulations is appended to this notice. The Committee will take into account any comments or objections made by or on behalf of people or organisations who would be affected by the regulations received by them not later than 5th May 1982. EXPLANATORY NOTE

These Regulations amend the Child Benefit (General) Regulations 1976 which are the "principal regulations". As they now stand, regulation 7 of the principal regulations provides for the continuation of child benefit in respect of a school leaver to a specified terminal date after leaving school. The dates are:

... the first Monday in January;

the first Monday following Easter Monday; and

the first Monday in September.

Regulation 2 provides that child benefit is not to be payable during the specified period for any week in which the school leaver is engaged in full-time gainful employment.

Where the question arises, it will be for the independent statutory authorities to decide whether employment is "full-time" and "gainful".

Regulation 3 concerns school leavers who receive financial support by way of payments under the Employment and Training Act 1973 — e.g., those on the Youth Opportunities Programme. As regulation 7B of the principal regulations now stands the general exclusion from child benefit of young persons receiving this type of financial support does not apply to any period prior to the specified terminal date. Regulation 3 will ensure that henceforth child benefit is not payable for any week when a young person is on a Youth Opportunities Programme course or other relevant sponsored training.

Regulation 4 concerns young persons receiving education by virtue of their employment. At present in regulation 8 of the principal regulations, entitlement to child benefit is not excluded for these persons if either the education lasts for a continuous period of at least six months and there is no financial support from the employment, or the first terminal date after leaving school has not yet been reached: Regulation 4 will ensure that entitlement is not excluded in the former case only — i.e. if there is continuous education and no financial support.

ULSTER SAVINGS CERTIFICATES
(TWENTY-FOURTH ISSUE) REGULATIONS 1982

The Department of Finance has made regulations—statutory rule 1982 No. 92 Ulster Savings Certificates (Twenty-fourth Issue) Regulations 1982 prescribing the terms of a new Twenty-fourth Issue to replace the Twenty-third Issue of Ulster Savings Certificates. The new certificates will be put on sale on 19th April 1982 with a purchase price of £25 for a single unit certificate which will increase in value to £38.32 on the fifth anniversary of purchase. The maximum permitted holding will be 100 units (purchase price £2500) which is in addition to the maxima of certificates of all previous Issues.

Ulster Savings Certificates (Seventh Issue) (Amendment)
Regulations 1982

The Department of Finance has made regulations—Statutory Rules 1982 No. 73 for Seventh Issue Ulster Savings Certificates extending the currency of the Issue by a further year Certificates of the Seventh Issue may now be held for 37 years from date of purchase with interest added in the 37th year at the rate of seven pence (7p) per 10/- (50p) unit for each completed period of 4 months with an additional halfpenny (½p) per unit at the end of the 37th year.

These regulations have had to be amended before coming into force on 1st April 1982 and the Department of Finance has made Statutory Rules 1982 No. 89 for the Seventh Issue Ulster Savings Certificates which revoke Statutory Rules 1982 No. 73. The effect of the amendment is that the interest payable during the 37th year is at the rate of six pence (6p) per 10/- (50p) unit for each completed period of 4 months.

Ulster Savings Certificates (Eleventh Issue)
Regulations 1982

Ulster Savings Certificates (Eleventh Issue) (Amendment) Regulations 1982

The Department of Finance has made regulations—Statutory Rules 1982 No. 72 for Eleventh Issue Ulster Savings Certificates extending the currency of the Issue for a further year. Certificates of the Eleventh Issue may now be held for 17 years from date of purchase with interest added in the 17th year at the rate of eight-pence (8p) per £1 unit for each completed period of 4 months with an additional one penny (1p) per unit at the end of the 17th year.

These regulations have had to be amended before coming into force on 28th March 1982 and the Department of Finance has made Statutory Rules 1982 No. 88 for the Eleventh Issue Ulster Savings Certificates which revoke Statutory Rules 1982 No. 72 The effect of the amendment is that the interest payable during the 17th year is at the rate of seventh pence (7p) per £1 unit for each completed period of 4 months.

The Department of the Environment has made a Statutory Rule under Article 3 of the Road Races (Northern Ireland) Order 1977 entitled the Road Races (Circuit of Ireland International Rally) Order (Northern Ireland) 1982 (SR 1982 No. 85).

The Order permits the Ulster Automobile Club as promoters of the Circuit of Ireland International Rally 1982 to use for that rally certain roads by suspending the right of way of other traffic during certain times on 9th, 10th and 13th April, 1982.

In effect the Order temporarily closes certain roads.

TREASURY DIRECTIONS DATED 23rd MARCH 1982 UNDER SECTION 19(2) AND (3) OF THE FINANCE ACT 1972 AS TO THE SUPPLY OF GOODS AND SERVICES BY GOVERNMENT DEPARTMENTS

(These Directions amend the Treasury Directions given under section 19(2) and (3) of the Finance Act 1972 dated 11th November 1975 and published in the Belfast Gazette of Friday 21st November 1975, as amended by the Treasury Directions dated 30th December 1976 and published in the Belfast Gazette of Friday 4th February 1977 and the Treasury Directions dated 12th September 1978 and published in the Belfast Gazette of Friday 27th October 1978).

The Treasury, in exercise of the powers conferred on them by section 19(2) and (3) of the Finance Act 1972 (1972 c.41) as amended by the Finance Act 1977 (1977 c.36) hereby direct as follows:

- 1. These directions shall come into operation on 1st April 1982.
- 2. In these directions:

"the directions" mean the Treasury directions given under section 19(2) and (3) of the Finance Act 1972 dated 11th November 1975 and amended by the Treasury directions dated 30th December 1976 and the Treasury directions dated 12th September 1978;

"the Schedules" mean the Schedules to the directions; and "column (1)" and "column (2)" respectively mean column (1) and column (2) of the Schedules.

3. Column (1) and column (2) of the Schedules specified in the left hand column of the table to this paragraph shall be amended respectively in accordance with the instructions contained in the middle and right hand columns of the table.

FOOTNOTES

- 1. This band is allocated to stations in the amateur service on a secondary basis on condition that they shall not cause interference to other services.
 - 2. This band is shared with other services.
- 3. This band is available to amateurs until further notice provided that use by the Licensee of any frequency in the band shall cease immediately on the demand of a Government official
- 4. The type of transmission known as Radio Teleprinter (RTTY) may not be used in this band.
- 5. Use by the Licensee of any frequency in this band shall be only with the prior written consent of the Secretary of State.
- 6. This band is not available for use within the area bounded by 53°NO2E, 55°NO2E, 53°NO3W and 55°NO3W.
- 7. In this band the power must not exceed 10 dBW erp (effective radiated power).
- 8. Use by the Licensee of any frequency in this band shall only be with written consent of the Secretary of State and such consent shall indicate the power which may be used, taking into consideration the characteristics of the Licensee's station.
 - 9. Slow Scan Television may be used in this band.
- . 10. High Definition Television (A3F, C3F, F3F, G3F) may be used in this band.
- 11. Facsimile Transmission (A3C, F3C, G3C) may be used in this band, with a bandwidth not greater than 6 kHz.
- 12. The amateur-satellite service also has an allocation in this band.
- 13. This band is allocated to stations in the amateursatellite service on a secondary basis, on condition that they shall not cause interference to other services.
- 14. The amateur-satellite service may operate in this band in accordance with International Radio Regulation 2741, viz:

Space stations in the amateur-satellite service operating in bands shared with other services shall be fitted with appropriate devices for controlling emissions in the event that harmful interference is reported in accordance with the procedure laid down in Article 22 of the Radio Regulations. (Administrations authorising such space stations shall inform the IFRB and shall ensure that sufficient earth command stations are established before launch to guarantee that any harmful interference which might be reported can be terminated by the authorising administration (see RR 2612)).

- 15. The use of the amateur-satellite service in the following bands shall be limited to the direction stated below:
 - 1260 1270 MHz Earth to Space
 - 5650 5670 MHz Earth to Space
 - 5830 5850 MHz Space to Earth
- 16. The bands allocated to the amateur service at 3.5, 7.0, 10.1, 14.0, 21.0, and 144 MHz may, in the event of natural disasters, be used by non-amateur stations to meet the needs of international emergency communications in the disaster area in accordance with regulations of the Radio Regulatory Department.
- 17. Since high intensities of RF radiation may be harmful, the following safety precaution must be taken: in locations to which people have access, the power density on transmit-must not exceed the limits recommended by the competent authorities. Currently this limit is 10 mW/cm².
- 18. Data transmission may be used within the frequency bands 144 MHz and above provided (a) the Station callsign is announced in morse or telephony at least once every 15 minutes and (b) emission is contained within the bandwidth normally used for telephony.

- A. DC input power is the total direct current power input to (i) the anode circuit of the valve(s) or (ii) ateur any other device energising the antenna.
 - B. As an alternative for R3E and J3E single sideband types of emission, the power shall be determined by the peak envelope power (PEP) under linear operation.
 - C. Double Side Band suppressed carrier emissions are permitted within the terms of this licence.
 - D. The symbols used to designate the classes of emission have the meaning assigned to them in the Telecommunication Convention, They are:

Amplitude Modulation

- A1A Telegraphy by on-off keying without the use of a modulating audio frequency.
- AlB Automatic telegraphy by on-off keying, without the use of a modulating audio frequency.
- A2A Telegraphy by on-off keying of an amplitudemodulating audio frequency or frequencies, or by on-off keying of the modulated emission.
- A2B Automatic telegraphy by on-off keying of an amplitude-modulating audio frequency or frequencies, or by on-off keying of the modulated emission.
- A3E Telephony, doubled sideband.
- A3C Facsimile Transmission.
- H3E Telephony using single sideband full carrier, amplitude modulation.
- R3E Telephony, single sideband, reduced carrier.
- J3E Telephony, single sideband, suppressed carrier.
- A3F/C3F Slow scan television and high definition television.

- FIA Telegraphy by frequency shift keying without the use of a modulating audio frequency: one of two frequencies being emitted at any instant.
- F1B Automatic telegraphy by frequency shift keying without the use of a modulating audio frequency.
- F2A Telegraphy by on-off keying of a frequency modulating audio frequency or frequencies, or by on-off keying of a frequency modulated emission.
 - F2B Automatic telegraphy by on-off keying of a frequency modulating audio frequency or frequencies, or by on-off keying of a frequency modulated emission.
 - F3E Telephony.
 - F3C Facsimile Transmission.
 - F3F Slow Scan Television and high definition television

Phase Modulation

- G1A Telegraphy by phase shift keying without the use of a modulating audio frequency.

- G2A Telegraphy by on-off keying of a phasemodulating audio frequency or frequencies, or by on-off keying of the phase-modulated emission.

Pulse Modulation

KIA Telegraphy by on-off keying of a pulsed carrier without the use of a modulating audio frequency.

- K2A Telegraphy by on-off keying of a modulating audio frequency or frequencies or by on-off keying of a modulated pulsed carrier the audio frequency or frequencies modulating the amplitude of the pulses.
- L2A Telegraphy by on-off keying of a modulating audio frequency or frequencies or by on-off keying of a modulated pulsed carrier the audio frequency or frequencies modulating the width (or duration) of the pulses.
- K3E Telephony, amplitude modulated pulses.
- L3E Telephony, width (or duration) modulated pulses.
- M2A Telegraphy by on-off keying of a modulating audio frequency or frequencies or by on-off keying of a modulated pulsed carrier the audio frequency or frequencies modulating the position or phase of the pulses.
- Q2A Telegraphy by on-off keying of a modulating audio frequency or frequencies or by on-off keying of a modulated pulsed carrier the audio frequency or frequencies modulating the angle of the carrier during the pulses.
- V2A Telegraphy by on-off keying of a modulating frequency or frequencies or by on-off keying of a modulated pulsed carrier which is a combination of the foregoing, or is produced by other means.

CLASSIFICATION OF EMISSIONS

Basic Characteristics

The basic characteristics of a radio emission are described by three symbols as follows:

- (i) first symbol—type of modulation of the main carrier;
- (ii) second symbol nature of Signal(s) modulating the main carrier;
- (iii) third symbol type of information to be transmitted.

INTERPRETATION

- (i) Carrier Power of a Radio Transmission. The average power supplied to the antenna from a transmitter during one radio frequency cycle under conditions of no modulation. This interpretation does not apply to pulse modulated emissions.
- (ii) Peak Envelope Power of a Radio Transmitter. The average power supplied to the antenna by a transmitter during one radio frequency cycle at the highest crest of the modulation envelope, taken under conditions of normal operation.
- (iii) Effective Radiated Power (e.r.p) (in a given direction): The product of the power supplied to the antenna and its gain relative to a half-wave dipole in a given direction.

EXCEPTING THAT HOLDERS OF AMATEUR (B) LICENCES ARE NOT PERMITTED THE USE OF RADIO FREQUENCIES BELOW 144 MHz OR THE USE OF A1A, A1B, A2A, A2B, F1A, F1B, F2A, F2B, G1A, G1B, G2A, G2B, K1A, K2A, L2A, M2A, Q2A, AND V2A TRANSMISSIONS.
