UR236 Ballymore Avenue from its junction with B192 Drumrane Road to its junction with UR236 Dogleap Road. UR236 Dogleap Road from a point approximately 50 yards north-east of its junction with UR236 Ballymore Avenue to its junction with B192 Drumrane Road.

The right of way of other traffic will be suspended on these roads on 8th May 1982 from 12.45 p.m. to 6.00 p.m. In effect this Order temporarily closes these roads.

Notice is hereby given that the Department of the Environment for Northern Ireland in exercise of the powers conferred on it by Article 25(1) of the Road Traffic (Northern Ireland) Order 1981 and of all other enabling powers made on 16th April 1982 an Order entitled Restriction of Traffic (Divis Street/Townsend Street, Belfast) Order (Northern Ireland) 1982 (SR 1982 No. 123) which will come into operation on 10th May 1982.
