Double Taxation — Seychelles

The Republic of Seychelles has given notice of termination of the Double Taxation Arrangement with the United Kingdom (SR & O 1947 No. 1778 as amended by SI 1969 No. 379 and SI 1974 No. 1272). The arrangement will cease to have effect in the United Kingdom from 6th April 1983 in respect of income tax and from 1st April 1983 in respect of corporation tax and in the Seychelles from 1st January 1983 in respect of income tax.

POST OFFICE

POST OFFICE SCHEME P5/1982

(Note: The Scheme which follows this note amends the Post Office (Postal Order) Scheme 1971. The amending Scheme which comes into operation on 23rd August 1982 provides for the discontinuation of postal orders for 55p, 65p, 85p and 95p. It revokes the Post Office (Postal Order) Amendment (No. 10) Scheme 1980 (Post Office Scheme P4/1980) which was made on 28th February 1980).

THE POST OFFICE (POSTAL ORDER) AMENDMENT (NO. 14) SCHEME 1982

Made 16th July 1982
Coming into operation 23rd August 1982

The Post Office, by virtue of the powers conferred upon it by section 28 of the Post Office Act 1969 and all other powers enabling it in this behalf, hereby makes the following Scheme:

Commencement and citation

- This Scheme:
 - shall come into operation on 23rd August 1982;
 - may be cited as the Post Office (Postal Order) Amendment (No. 14) Scheme 1982;
 - shall be read as one with the Post Office (Postal Order) Scheme 1971 (Post Office Scheme P5/1971)

(hereinafter called "the Scheme"), the Post Office (Postal Order) Amendment (No. 1) Scheme 1973 (Post Office Scheme P4/1973) and the Post Office (Postal Order) Amendment (No. 13) Scheme 1982 (Post Office Scheme P4/1982).

Issue and amounts of postal orders

- For sub-paragraph (1) of paragraph 4 of the Scheme there shall be substituted the following:—

"(1) Postal Orders may be issued for the following sums:—

- the sum of 25 pence and any greater multiple of five pence up to and including fifty pence;
- the sum of 60 pence, 70 pence, 75 pence, 80 pence, 90 pence and one pound;
- the sum of two pounds, three pounds, four pounds, five pounds, six pounds, seven pounds, eight pounds, nine pounds and ten pounds."

Revocation

- The Post Office (Postal Order) Amendment (No. 10) Scheme 1980 (Post Office Scheme P4/1980) made on 28th February 1980 is hereby revoked.

THE IMPORTED FOOD (NORTHERN IRELAND)
REGULATIONS 1968

Brazil : Official Certificate

The Department of Health and Social Services with the approval of the Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food and the Secretary of State for Wales gives notice that, in exercise of the powers conferred on it by the Imported Food (Northern Ireland) Regulations 1968 as amended by the Imported Food (Northern Ireland) (Amendment) Regulations 1973, 1979 and 1981, it hereby recognises, subject to the conditions hereinafter set out, the Official Certificates described in Part I of the Schedule hereto for the importation from Brazil of meat and meat products as showing:

- (a) that the meat to which they relate, or the meat from which the meat product to which they relate was prepared, was derived from mammals inspected before and after death in the country of origin of the meat and passed in accordance with criteria satisfactory to the Ministers; and
- (b) that the dressing, packing and other preparation of the meat was carried out with all necessary precautions for the prevention of danger to health.

The said Official Certificates are recognised subject to the following conditions:

- (i) Recognition applies only to meat and meat products imported from Brazil.
- (ii) Where the Official Certificates are in the form of labels, recognition will apply only if the labels are securely affixed to the meat or the meat product and the package containing the meat or meat product, and if the labels have not in any other circumstances or on any other occasion been used as Official Certificates.
- (iii) Where the Official Certificates are in the form of stamps, recognition will apply only if the stamps are clearly impressed or otherwise marked on the meat or the meat products and the package containing the meat or meat product.
- (iv) Recognition of the Official Certificates is restricted to the extent indicated in Part II of the Schedule hereto.

The Notices published in the Belfast Gazette dated 18 December 1981, 25 April 1980 and 6 December 1968 are hereby revoked.

The name BRASIL in capitals or, if appropriate the set of initials approved for that country under the International Convention on Motor Vehicle Registration, viz: BR.

in the centre:

the number of the establishment.

The letters must be 0.8 cm high and the figures 1 cm high.

The seal may include an indication of the official veterinarian who carried out the health inspection of the meat.

For meat products (including canned meat), a stamp of one of the following designs:



The Certificate will be completed by the insertion of the number of the establishment between "Inspeccionado" and "S.I.F."

The Official Certificate to be completed by the insertion of one of the numbers in Part II of this Schedule.

The Agricultural Marketing (N.I.) Order 1982 No. 1080 (N.I. 12)

This Order brings the Pigs Marketing Board (N.I.) into a form which is compatible with E.C. law; puts the milk Marketing Board for Northern Ireland on a similar basis to other Milk Marketing Boards in Great Britain; and provides for the disposal of any assets remaining after the winding up of the Seed Potato Marketing Board for Northern Ireland.

The Appropriation (No. 2) (N.I.) Order 1982 No. 1081 (N.I. 13)

This Order is to authorise the issue from the Consolidated Fund and Appropriate for the various services detailed in the schedules to the Order, the sums required for Northern Ireland Departments to carry out their functions.

The Forfeiture (N.I.) Order 1982 No. 1082 (N.I. 14)

This Order provides a court with power to modify the effects of the forfeiture rule (the rule of public policy which precludes a person who has unlawfully killed another from acquiring a benefit in consequence of the killing). It also provides for the question of whether pension and security benefits are subject to forfeiture following an unlawful killing to be determined by the Social Security Commissioner.

The Industrial Development (N.I.) Order 1982 No. 1083 (N.I. 15)

This Order provides for the setting up of a new Industrial Development Board for Northern Ireland, the dissolution of the Northern Ireland Development Agency and the consolidation, with amendments, of the existing industrial development legislation into a single statute.

The Social Security (N.I.) Order 1982 No. 1084 (N.I. 16)

The Order makes provision for statutory sick pay by employers and makes a number of miscellaneous amendments in the law relating to social security and war pensions.

The Northern Ireland Act 1974 (Interim Period Extension) Order 1982 No. 957

This Order extends the period of direct rule by 12 months from July 1982.

The Northern Ireland (Emergency Provisions) Act 1978 (Continuance) Order 1982 No. 956

This Order continues in force the temporary provisions of the N.I. (Emergency Provisions) Act 1978 for a further six months from July 1982.

The Assembly (Day of Election) (N.I.) Order No. 1078

This Order appoints the 20th October 1982 as the day for the election of a Northern Ireland Assembly.

The Northern Ireland Assembly Elections (Pay & Allowance) (N.I.) Order No. 1079

This Order prescribes the salaries and allowances for the Northern Ireland Assembly.
