DEPARTMENT OF THE ENVIRONMENT

Notice is hereby given that the Department of the Environment by virtue of the powers conferred on it by the Roads (Northern Ireland) Order 1980 has made an Order dated 15th July 1982 entitled Route C324 (Clarkill Road) Castlewellan (Abandonment) Order (Northern Ireland) 1982 (SR No. 213) which will come into operation on 27th August 1982.

The Department hereby gives notice of its intention to make an Order under Article 40 of the Roads (Northern Ireland) Order 1980 the effect of which would be to abandon the link road between Dunbar Street and Great Patrick Street in the City of Belfast.

The road proposed to be abandoned is delineated on a map which, together with a copy of the draft Order, may be inspected free of charge at all reasonable hours during the period from 13th August 1982 to 24th September 1982 at the office of the Department, Roads Service Headquarters Room 215, Commonwealth House, 35 Castle Street, Belfast, BT1 1GU and the Department's Divisional Roads Service Section Office, 1 Great George's Street, Belfast.

Any person may within the said period object to the proposal by written notice to Roads Service Headquarters at the above address stating the grounds of objection.

The Department hereby gives notice of its intention to make an Order under Article 40 of the Roads (Northern Ireland) Order 1980 the effect of which would be to stop-up Stewartstown Road, Dunmurry to road traffic at a line approximately 60 metres north of the junction with Twinbrook Road and at a line approximately 110 metres south of the junction with Poleglass Lane, in the townlands of Milleaton and Poleglass and County of Antrim.

Notice is hereby given that the Department of the Environment for Northern Ireland in exercise of the powers conferred on it by Article 25(1) of The Road Traffic (Northern Ireland) Order 1981 and of all other enabling powers made on 26th July 1982 an Order entitled Restriction of Traffic (Dock Street, Belfast) (No. 3) Order (Northern Ireland) 1982 (SR 1982 No. 222) which will come into operation on 22nd August 1982.

The purpose of the Order is to prohibit vehicles from using Dock Street, Belfast, from its junction with York Street, to its junction with Garmoyle Street, for a further period of one month from 21st August 1982, to enable works to be executed.

Notice is hereby given that the Department of the Environment for Northern Ireland in exercise of the powers conferred on it by Article 22(1) of the Road Traffic (Northern Ireland) Order 1981 and of all other enabling powers made on 5th July 1982 an Order entitled Traffic Weight Restriction (Templepatrick) Order (Northern Ireland) 1982 (SR 1982 No. 204) which will come into operation on 26th August 1982.

The purpose of the order is to prohibit vehicles exceeding 3 tons laden or unladen weight from using the Cloughanduff Road, Templepatrick.

Provision is made to exempt vehicles requiring access.

The Department of the Environment has made a Statutory Rule under Articles 3 and 4 of the Road Races (Northern Ireland) Order 1977 entitled Road Races (Ulster Grand Prix) Order (Northern Ireland) 1982 (SR 1982 No. 224).

The Order permits the Ulster Centre Promotions Limited, as promoter of the Ulster Grand Prix Motor Cycle Race, to use for that race, and practices therefor, certain roads by suspending the right of way of other traffic during certain times on 18th, 19th and 21st August 1982.

In effect this Order temporarily closes certain roads.

The Department of the Environment has made a Statutory Rule under Article 3 of the Road Races (Northern Ireland) Order 1977 entitled Road Races (Carrowdore 100) Order (Northern Ireland) 1982 (SR 1982 No. 225).

This Order permits the Belfast and District Motor Club Limited, as promoter of the Carrodore 100 Motor Cycle Race, to use for that race certain roads by suspending the right of way of other traffic on 4th September 1982, from 12.00 noon to 6.30 p.m. In effect this Order temporarily closes certain roads.
