NORTHERN IRELAND OFFICE

Notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State in exercise of the powers conferred by Article 10 of the Family Law Reform (Northern Ireland) Order 1977 has made Regulations entitled "The Blood Tests (Evidence of Paternity) (Amendment) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1982". (S.R. No. 323, 1982).

These Regulations which come into operation on 15th November, 1982, increase the fees payable under the Blood Tests (Evidence of Paternity) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1978 (S.R. 1978, No. 379) to samplers and testers in respect of blood tests carried out for the purpose of determining paternity in civil proceedings. For samplers the increases are approximately 15% and for testers between 20% and 24%.

PRESERVATIVES IN FOOD (AMENDMENT) REGULATIONS (NORTHERN IRELAND) 1982 (SR 1982 No. 297)

These regulations, which come into operation on 1st November, 1982, further amend the Preservatives in Food Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1980.

The regulations:

- Reduce the permitted levels of nitrites and nitrates in cured meats and cheese;
- Permit the use of specified preservatives in gelatin capsules (as used for vitamin supplements), shrimps, prawns and scampi, canned crabmeat and concentrated snack meals;
- Permit an additional specified preservative in cut mixed peel.

The regulations implement Commission Directive 79/1066/EEC (Official Journal No. L327, 24.12.79, p.17) laying down Community methods of analysis for determining the caffeine and dry matter content in coffee extracts and chicory extracts. Because of the complexity, technical nature and length of the methods of analysis, they have been incorporated in the regulations by reference to the Directive.

**THE IMPORTED FOOD (NORTHERN IRELAND)
REGULATIONS 1968**

Argentina: Official Certificate

The Department of Health and Social Services with the approval of the Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food and the Secretary of State for Wales gives notice that, in exercise of the powers conferred on it by the Imported Food (Northern Ireland) Regulations 1968 as amended by the Imported Food (Northern Ireland) (Amendment) Regulations 1973, 1979 and 1981, it hereby recognises, subject to the conditions hereinafter set out, the Official Certificates of which particulars are given in the Schedule hereto as showing:—

- (a) that the meat to which they relate was derived from mammals inspected before and after death in the country of origin of the meat and passed in accordance with criteria satisfactory to the Minister and
- (b) that the dressing, packing and other preparation of the meat was carried out with all necessary precautions for the prevention of danger to health.

1. Recognition of the Official Certificates is extended to include:—

Carcases or portions of carcasses comprising recognisable wholesale or retail cuts, with or without bone, which contain no associated lymphatic glands or from which any pleura, peritoneum or lymphatic gland has been removed.

2. The said certificates are recognised subject to the following conditions:—

- (a) This recognition applies to the importation of meat from Argentina.
- (b) Where the Official Certificates are in the form of labels, the recognition will apply only if the labels are securely affixed to the meat and the package containing the meat, and if the labels have not in any other circumstances or on any other occasion been used as Official Certificates.
- (c) Where the Official Certificates are in the form of stamps, the recognition will apply only if the stamps are clearly impressed or otherwise marked on the meat and the package containing the meat.
- (d) Recognition of the Official Certificates is restricted to the extent indicated in the Schedule to this Notice.

The Notices published in the Belfast Gazette dated 10 October 1980 and 13 November 1981 are hereby revoked.

For specified fresh meat: the Official Certificate shall consist of either:—

- (a) A stamp of the following design:—



(b) An oval mark 6.5cm wide by 4.5cm high. The following information must appear on the mark in perfectly legible characters:

- on the upper part, ARGENTINA in capitals, or, if appropriate, the set of initials approved under the International Convention of Motor Vehicle Registration, Viz:—RA.
- in the centre, the veterinary approval number of the slaughterhouse.

The letters must be 0.8cm high and the figures 1cm high. The seal may include an indication of the official veterinarian who carried out the health inspection.

The Official Certificates will be completed by the insertion of the establishment number.

NOTE:

Imports of meat and meat products (including poultry meat) into Northern Ireland are restricted or prohibited under Diseases of Animals legislation by the Department of Agriculture and applications for such importations must be made to that Department. Official Certificates for public health purposes in accordance with the Imported Food (Northern Ireland) Regulations, 1968, do not confer any exemption from these restrictions or prohibitions.

DEPARTMENT OF THE ENVIRONMENT

The Department hereby gives notice of its intention to make an Order under Article 40 of the Roads (Northern Ireland) Order 1980 the effect of which would be to abandon the entire length of Lorne Street and approximately 140 metres of service road extending in a northerly direction from its junction with Lorne Street in the City of Londonderry.

This Order, which comes into operation on 8th November 1982, increases from £1,250 to £1,525 the maximum amount to be paid by an insurer or owner of a motor vehicle for hospital in-patient treatment of each road traffic casualty in respect of whose death or injury the insurer or owner has made a payment to which Article 99 of the Road Traffic (Northern Ireland) Order 1981 applies.

The increase applies only in respect of accidents occurring on or after 8th November 1982.
