**ABANDONMENT OF CANAL. COMPENSATION.**

NOTICE is hereby given that, in pursuance of the powers conferred by sub-section (8) of Section 45 of the Railway and Canal Traffic Act, 1888 (as the said section applies in Northern Ireland), and of all other powers it

thereunto enabling, the Ministry of Commerce has on the 9th July, 1929, made Regulations with respect to claims for compensation arising in connection with the application of the Lagan Navigation Company for a Warrant authorising the abandonment of the portions of the Ulster Canal, situate in Northern Ireland.
