NATIONAL HEALTH INSURANCE ACT, 1926.

NOTICE is hereby given under the Rules Publications Act, 1893, that it is proposed by the National Health Insurance Joint Committee with the approval of the Treasury, after the expiration of at least 40 days from this date, in exercise of the powers conferred upon them by Sub-section (2) of Section 59 of the National Health Insurance Act, 1926, to make Regulations amending the National Health Insurance

(Navy, Army and Air Force) Regulations, 1924:

And that on account of urgency the National Health Insurance Joint Committee, with the approval of the Treasury, under Section 2 of the Rules Publications Act, 1893, made Regulations entitled the National Health Insurance (Navy, Army and Air Force) Amendment Regulations (No. 2), 1929, to come into force immediately as provisional regulations, to continue in force until regulations have been made in accordance with the provisions of Section 1 of that Act;
