SOCIAL SECURITY ADVISORY COMMITTEE

NOTICE OF SUBMISSION OF PROPOSALS TO AMEND THE SUPPLEMENTARY BENEFIT REGULATIONS

The Social Security Advisory Committee gives notice that it has been asked by the Secretary of State for Social Services under Section 10 of the Social Security Act 1980 to consider and report on proposals to amend the supplementary benefit regulations.

These proposals apply to Great Britain only. Corresponding provision for Northern Ireland will be made in regulations made by the Department of Health and Social Services for Northern Ireland. The Northern Ireland regulations will not require separate submission to the Social Security Advisory Committee by virtue of paragraph 21 of Schedule 3 to the Social Security Act 1980 (1980 c. 30).

A short explanatory note provided by the Department of Health and Social Security on these proposals is appended to this notice. The Committee will take into account any comments or objections made by or on behalf of people or organisations who would be affected by the regulations received by them not later than 29th April 1983. EXPLANATORY NOTE

A number of changes to the supplementary benefit regulations are proposed. These include:

- (i) a number of improvements in the single payments provisions; for example, safety gates are added to the items of household equipment for which single payments can be awarded;
- (ii) the payment of additional requirements for the additional cost of clothing and footwear where the costs are greater than average because the claimant is disabled or of abnormal stature;
- (iii) the reduction of gaps between the Great Britain and Northern Ireland supplementary benefits scheme;

- (iv) the amount of voluntary unemployment deduction from supplementary benefit will be reduced only in cases where there is pregnancy or serious illness in the family;
- (v) the payment of a set minimum for housing requirements to joint householders where their actual requirements are less than that amount is abolished.

Draft regulations to give effect to the proposals are expected to be referred to the Committee at the end of March, but views are being sought now to give interested organisations more time to comment.

- (ii) Where the Official Certificate is in the form of a stamp or mark recognition will apply only if the stamp or mark is clearly impressed or otherwise marked on the meat product and on the package containing the meat product;
- (iii) Recognition will apply only if each consignment of meat products bearing the said Official Certificate for cured or smoked meats or meat products is accompanied by a properly completed Health Certificate in the form prescribed in the Schedule to the Notice published in the Belfast Gazette dated 24 August 1979;

THE NORTHERN IRELAND (EMERGENCY PROVISIONS) (VEHICLE CONTROL ZONE) ORDER 1983

In pursuance of regulation 2 of the Northern Ireland (Emergency Provisions) Regulations 1978 which are set out in Schedule 3 of the Northern Ireland (Emergency Provisions) Act 1978(a), I hereby make the following Order:

1. This Order may be cited as the Northern Ireland (Emergency Provisions) (Vehicle Control Zone) Order 1983 and shall come into operation on 1st April 1983.

2. (1) In this Order—

“control zone” means a road or other area specified in column 1 of the Schedule to this Order;

“road” means any highway and any other road to which the public has access, and includes a road over a bridge;

“vehicle” includes a motor or pedal cycle.

(2) For the purposes of this Order—

(a) a pedal cycle is to be treated as unattended unless a person is on or immediately beside and in attendance upon it; and

(b) a motor cycle is to be treated as unattended unless a person who has attained the age of fifteen years is on or immediately beside and in attendance upon it; and

(c) any other vehicle is to be treated as unattended unless a person who has attained the age of fifteen years is in or on the vehicle.

3. This Order applies to all vehicles other than—

(a) a vehicle being used by a member of the Royal Ulster Constabulary or of Her Majesty's Forces on duty;

(a) 1978 c.5

(b) an ambulance;

(c) a vehicle being used by a medical practitioner, nurse or midwife on duty and on which is displayed a badge of a kind approved by the British Medical Association;

(d) a fire-fighting appliance.

4. Subject to the provisions of this Order, the use by vehicles to which this Order applies of a road being or being within, a control zone specified in column 1 of a Schedule to this Order shall be subject to the restrictions specified in relation to that zone in column 2 of that Schedule.

5. A member of the Royal Ulster Constabulary, or of Her Majesty's Forces, who is on duty at any time to exclude vehicles from a control zone specified in Part I of a Schedule to this Order may admit any vehicle which would, under the restrictions applying to that zone at that time, be required to be excluded and may authorise the vehicle to remain in that zone for such period (not extending beyond the period of those restrictions) and subject to such conditions as he may specify.

Interpretation

and "the blind" shall be construed accordingly."

Express delivery

(2) In sub-paragraph (5) of paragraph 28 of the Scheme, the words "if the addressee refuses to pay the amount payable in respect of the deficiency, it shall be paid by the sender." shall be deleted and the words "there shall be payable by the addressee on the delivery of the packet, or, if the packet is refused or cannot for any other reason be delivered, by the sender, such amount as the Post Office may determine." inserted in their place.

Redirection by the public

9. In sub-paragraph (3) of paragraph 32 of the Scheme, the words "an amount equal to that which would be charged and prepayable thereon if, instead of being redirected, it were posted anew to that address (otherwise than as a registered postal packet or a recorded delivery packet)," shall be deleted and the words "such an amount as the Post Office may determine." inserted in their place. The words "served from" shall be deleted and the word "in" inserted in their place.

Compulsory registration

10. In paragraph (3) of paragraph 40 of the Scheme, the words "an additional sum equal to the difference between the amount of the postage paid thereon and the amount of the postage which would have been payable if the letter had been posted as a first class letter." shall be deleted and the words "such additional amount as the Post Office may determine." inserted in their place.

Compensation for certain other postal packets

11. In sub-paragraph (3) of paragraph 47 of the Scheme as subsequently amended, the figure "£16.50" shall read "£17".

Cash on delivery — fees and conditions

12. In sub-paragraph (3) of paragraph 48 of the Scheme as subsequently amended, the figure "£300" shall read "£350".
