NATIONAL HEALTH INSURANCE ACTS, 1924 to 1928.

NOTICE is hereby given under the Rules Publication Act, 1893, that it is proposed by the National Health Insurance Joint Committee, after the expiration of at least 40 days from this date, in exercise of the powers conferred upon them by the National Health Insurance Acts, 1924 to 1928, to make Regulations, entitled the National Health Insurance and Contributory Pensions (Voluntary Contributors) Regulations, 1929;

And that on account of urgency the National Health Joint Committee under section 2 of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, made Regulations, entitled the National Health Insurance and Contributory Pensions (Voluntary Contributors) Regulations, 1929, to come into force immediately as provisional regulations, to continue in force until regulations have been made in accordance with the provisions of Section 1 of that Act;
