THE MINISTRY OF HOME AFFAIRS FOR NORTHERN IRELAND.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Castlederg Union;

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Londonderry Union;

and to all others whom it may concern:

WHEREAS by Section 1 of the Poor Relief (Ireland) Act, 1914, as amended by Section 23 (4) of the Local Government (Emergency Provisions) Act, 1916, it is enacted in effect as follows:—

(1) The Local Government Board for Ireland may by Order modify or repeal the provisions of Section 9 of the Poor Relief (Ireland) Act, 1847 (which prohibits the giving of relief from the poor rates of a union to any person not within the union when so relieved) so far as respects any union specified in the order if, in the opinion of the Board, the modification or repeal is necessary or expedient for the better administration of the Poor Relief (Ireland) Acts, 1838 to 1900, and may by the same or any subsequent order make or provide for such adjustments and apportionments of the property, powers, duties, income, liabilities, and expenses of any Board of Guardians or other local authority affected as appear to the Board to be proper: (2) An Order under this section may contain such consequential, incidental and supplemental provisions as the Board may deem necessary, and shall have effect as from any date which may be specified therein for the purpose:

And whereas by virtue of the Government of Ireland Act, 1920, the aforesaid functions of the Local Government Board for Ireland, as regards services in Northern Ireland, have been transferred to the Ministry of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland (hereinafter refered to as "the Ministry"):

"the Ministry"): And whereas by an Order bearing date the 22nd day of August, 1929, and made in pursuance of the provisions of the aforesaid enactments, the Ministry ordered and declared that, notwithstanding the provisions of section 9 of the Poor Relief (Ireland) Act, 1849, as from the First day of October, 1929, destitute poor persons who by law were or should be entitled to relief (other than outdoor relief or medical or surgical relief) in the Castlederg Union might be lawfully relieved in the Londonderry Union until the Ministry should otherwise direct, and the said Order contained certain consequential, incidental and supplemental provisions which the Ministry deemed necessary:

And whereas it is necessary and expedient for the better administration of the Poor Relief (Ireland) Acts, 1838 to 1900, that the provisions of section 9 of the Poor Relief (Ireland) Act, 1847, should as respects the Castlederg Union and the Londonderry Union, be further modified in order that poor persons within the Castlederg Union affected with Fever or other dangerous contagious disease may be lawfully removed to and relieved in the Fever Hospital of the Londonderry Union, and it is necessary to make and specify the provisions hereinafter appearing with respect to the said Unions:
