#### INDEX-LINKED NATIONAL SAVINGS

*Movement of the United Kingdom General Index of Retail Prices*

For the purpose of revaluing on repayment Index-Linked National Savings Certificates (Retirement Issue and 2nd Index-Linked Issue) and contributions under Save As You Earn savings contracts (Third Issue) in accordance with the relevant prospectuses, the Index figure issued by the Department of Employment in the month of April, 1984 and applicable to the month of May, 1984 is 345.1.

### DEPARTMENT OF THE ENVIRONMENT

Notice is hereby given that the Department of the Environment for Northern Ireland, in exercise of the powers conferred upon it by Article 86(1), (2) and 7 of the Housing (Northern Ireland) Order 1981, has made a Statutory Rule entitled the Homes Insulation Scheme and Grants (Amendment) Order (Northern Ireland) 1984.

This Order substitutes a revised Schedule of specified materials on which grant may be paid for the Schedule to the Homes Insulation Scheme (Northern Ireland) 1983, contained in the Homes Insulation Scheme and Grants Order (Northern Ireland) 1983.

The revised Schedule contains 4 new products and 4 new brand names, and alters the thickness specified in the case of 2 products because of changes in the Agrément Certificates.

The Department hereby gives notice of its intention to make an Order under Article 40 of the Roads (Northern Ireland) Order 1980 the effect of which would be to abandon a length of approximately 24 metres of footway to the west of No. 14 Borough Place North in the town of Portadown and County of Armagh.

Approximately 19 metres of Ventry Lane extending in a northerly direction from its junction with Ventry Street.

Approximately 18 metres of Little Victoria Street extending in a southerly direction from its junction with Harmony Street.
